Salo will get nationwide visibility this spring as MTV3 starts airing the Mobile 101 (Finnish title: Made in Finland) series that tells the story of the Nokia mobile phone manufacturer. The series has been shot on-location at places such as the old Nokia facilities at what is now the IoT Campus in Salo. The series has also been shot at the Hotel Fjalar in Salo and the old OP Bank in Kuusjoki.

Mobile 101 series

Mobile 101 is a drama series based on true events depicting the rise of Nokia to international success. The series has six episodes and concerns the period 1988–1990. The main characters include young lawyers, brilliant engineers and a progressive CEO, who all contributed to Nokia's rise to the world's biggest mobile phone manufacturer.

An armchair trip to Salo followed by a real one

The cast of the show include some of today's most interesting actors,

including Satu-Tuuli Karhu, Emil Kihlström, Aku Sipola, Oona Airola and Sampo Sarkola. The series was written and directed by Maarit Lalli. The series was first aired on the C More streaming service in spring 2022.

You can sense the Nokia atmosphere at the Salo Electronics Museum, located fairly close to the IoT Campus. 28 January–23 April The 90th Anniversary of Turku Printmakers Association – Printed Worlds

Printed Worlds provides an overview of the current state and methods of printmaking in Turku and the rest of Finland. The exhibition has been curated by artist, printmaker Juha Joro, and it includes works by twelve members of Turku Printmakers Association: Annika Dahlsten, Markku Haanpää, Katri Ikävalko, Sirkku Ketola, Heli Kurunsaari, Miina Laine, Teija Lehto, Sara Manninen, Laura Miettinen, Tiina Vainio, Hanna Varis and Jirko Viljanen.

6 May–10 September Gertrude Bell and Meeri Koutaniemi: Hidden Freedom

The summer exhibition presents a dialogue between the documentary photographers Gertrude Bell (1868–1926) and Meeri Koutaniemi (b. 1987). Bell was a British artist who worked as an explorer, author, political officer, archaeologist and spy in the early 20th century. Koutaniemi has gained renown for her photographs that deal with social topics and human rights issues. The exhibition displays documentation produced by the two photographers in the same Middle Eastern and Asian countries in two different eras.

30 September 2023-7 January 2024 Jarno Vesala

Jarno Vesala (b. in 1977) is known for his installations combining sound, moving image and human figures. The artworks are based on observation and illusion, and they create an atmosphere that is mystical, even suspenseful. The viewer plays an important role in the course of events. The artwork is simultaneously a static, three-dimensional photograph and a scene that unfolds around the viewer. Vesala uses small gestures to ask questions about the human condition.

Made in Salo Exhibition

Get enraptured by old radios, televisions, telephones and monitors!

The Made in Salo exhibition brings light to the development and production history of communication devices and electronics industry from the late 1920s to today. The exhibition particularly showcases radios, televisions, radiophones and mobile phones and monitors designed and manufactured in Salo. The museum presents the devices and production equipment designed and manufactured by Salora, Mobira, Nokia's different units and Benefon. The museum also has a still-operating production cell of the Nokia mobile phone factory.

Visit the Electronic Museum to recall the old radios and televisions at your grandparents' place, the programmes you used to listen and watch in the old days, the landline telephones you once used to make a call, and your very first mobile phone. Play old video games from the 1980s and 1990s, watch production videos, listen and watch old radio and TV programmes and see faces you recognise from TV in the 1950s to 1970s. You can also share your own memories and stories about different communication devices in the museum.

LOCAL MUSEUMS

Halikko Museum, Kirkkorinne 7, Halikko

Halikko Museum is located near Halikko Church, in a sturdy stone granary completed in 1849. This former granary illustrates the history of Halikko region on three floors through farming and craft occupations. The museum also displays the Count Armfelt weapons collection and has an exhibition depicting life and history at the Halikko district mental hospital.

Kiikala local history museum, Porvarinpolku 10, Kiikala

The museum grounds have seven buildings that have been moved there from around Kiikala. The museum has an extensive collection of traditional peasant artefacts, items from the Kiikala pharmacy and products from the Johannislund glass factory.

Kreivinmäki Outdoor Museum, Viurilantie 34, 24910 Halikko

On top of a high hill, a smock mill dating back to the 1800s still stands on its original location. The mill was originally the property of the Vuorentaka Manor. The area also includes loft storehouse and granary as well as a miller's croft from the 1700s. The croft is private property. The museum area can be freely explored all year round.

Meritalo museum, Moisionkatu 18, Salo

Meritalo has been serving as a museum for 50 years this year. The museum is located in the centre of the old Salo, in the Moisio neighbourhood. The atmospheric former school building showcases a classroom as well as an apartment of a teacher family from the late 19th, early 20th century. Refresh yourself in the lush museum garden and familiarise yourself with old, traditional plants. You can also visit the garden outside the museum's opening hours. The joyful Entten tentten ("Eeny, meeny") exhibition of summer 2023 takes visitors to the happy world of play and toys.

Perniö museum, Museotie 9, Perniö

The exhibition in the museum completed in 1930 showcases the rich history of Perniö region and life in the area. In the summer of 2023, a new changing exhibition, Perniöön ja takaisin – sukumme naiskohtaloita ("To Perniö and Back Again – the fates of women in our family"), opens at the museum, telling the interesting story of visual artist Aurora Reinhart and her mother, ceramic artist Catharina Kajander.

Suomusjärvi local history museum, Karjalohjantie 161–2, Suomusjärvi

An atmospheric wooden granary located next to the Suomusjärvi Church exhibits local peasant culture, tools of craftsmen, church artefacts and prehistorical discoveries as well as a special curiosity, a miraculous perpetual motion machine.

Trömperi Inn, Vanha Turuntie 1326, Hajala

The idyllic Trömperi is located along the Kuninkaantie road and has attracted many a traveller to come and rest within its walls over the years. According to legend, counts and royalty used to visit the Trömperi inn on their hunting and fishing trips. The building was owned by the same family all the way until 1971, at which point the buildings and all their items were bequeathed to museum use. Trömperi is protected under the Act on the Protection of the Built Heritage. A cosy summer café operates in the museum during its opening hours and the museum organises lots of events during the summer.





Local Museums of the Salo Historical Museum SAMU

In addition to Salo Electronics Museum, Salo Historical Museum SAMU comprises seven local museums in the greater Salo region.

The museums are primarily open in the summer and at other times upon agreement. All local museums have free entry during the opening hours. The museums have theme days and events. Find information about them and the opening hours at www.salomus.fi.

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Teijo National Park and the region's lively Ironworks Villages

Get enchanted by the peace of nature, go for a hike, paddle, take a dip in the water and continue your trek. Experience a whole range of delightful cultural history at the vibrant ironworks villages where activities are organised around the year.



Three ironworks, Mathildedal, Teijo and Kirjakkala, once operated right next to the Teijo National Park, by the sea. Densely populated village communities formed around the ironworks in the 1600s and 1800s. Today, the villages are a major culture-historical destination combining history, art and craftmanship. The unique atmosphere, versatile leisure time activities and rich culture of the villages draw in visitors from near and far.

Immerse yourself in the history of the ironworks villages at captivating events In the spring, as nature starts to bloom, Teijon Masuuni will organise the Ruukki Kukkii – oldtimey handicrafts market on 27 May. This is a great day for getting to know the history of the Teijo ironworks milieu. See vendor booths for craft items and local food as well as summer flowers, saplings and herbs and pop up foods. Teijo Masuuni's high-quality art exhibitions, café and shops are also open. The Teijo Church, Finland's smallest stone-built church, also has an open day.

Get to know the cultural heritage of the Mathildedal Ironworks on the **Ironworks Day 26 August** Already held for the thirteenth time, the event offers guided ironworks tours, lectures, music, traditional games for children and artisans' market where you can buy local crafts. In the autumn, the historical museum of the Mathildedal Ironworks is turned into the **Ghost Museum** for a little over two weeks. The scary Ghost Museum includes activities for the whole family and is open every day from 14 to 31 October. Lights, music and props are used to create a special atmosphere to the museum.

Hustle and bustle meets the peace of nature

There is plenty to see and experience at the ironworks villages. Its cafés, restaurants, shops and museums welcome all visitors. The art exhibitions at Teijon Masuuni are open year-round with the exception of midwinter. Free admission. See summer theatre performances and experience live music at the Mathildedal Ironworks Village, for example in the Mathildan Marina and village restaurant Terho. There is yoga on the pier and singing bowl relaxation exercises at Mathildan Marina every Wednesday from 28 June to 2 August. Read more about the activities offered at the ironworks villages on the following pages.

Nature lovers should also definitely visit the Teijo National Park. The national park area has in total around 50 kilometres of marked trails. Even on a short trek, you can see stark rocks, lake scenery, peat and forest. The area also has campfire sites, lean-tos and fishing spots.

Ironwork villages prepare for Christmas

Get a head start on Christmas at the ironworks village Christmas market. Try tasty treats and buy high-quality crafts and food products from local producers. The **Mathildedal Christmas Market** is organised on 25 November and 2 December at 1 p.m.–7 p.m. During the event, the whole Mathildedal village is decorated for Christmas and all the shops, cafés and restaurants are open. Come over to shop, enjoy a Christmas meal or try traditional rise porridge. Christmas-themed activities are organised for children. You can also get Belgian hot chocolate, which has become a huge hit, at the market. You'll find enough things to spend the whole day at the outdoor event so you better dress warmly.

You can also experience enchanted Christmas at the artisans' Christmas market organised by Teijon Masuuni. The two-day **Teijon Masuuni Christmas Market** is held on 2–3 December at 11 a.m.–4 p.m. The market is organised in heated indoor spaces and an atmospheric yard of the idyllic Teijo ironworks milieu. Artisans and their products play the main role at the market. The Christmas Market provides a great way to support Finnish crafts and local production by buying high-quality handmade products to give as Christmas presents and decorate your home with straight from the makers. The art exhibitions, café, art and crafts shop and other shops of Teijon Masuuni are also open during the event. M

Vibrant life in the archipelago in Särkisalo

The sea, beaches, guest harbours and cliffs with gorgeous views and idyllic summer cafés and restaurants make Särkisalo the perfect holiday destination for anyone who loves to spend time in the archipelago. There is plenty to do and see until late autumn, when the traditional Baltic Herring Festival takes place.

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Summer is a vibrant time in Särkisalo, the southernmost point of Salo. This is when the area's number of inhabitants grows four-fold as those with summer cottages come to spend time in their holiday dwellings. The harbors are also filled with boats. Visitors can enjoy local delicacies on the terraces of summer cafés and restaurants in a beautiful nature scenery. Särkisalo is surrounded by the sea and the area has diverse tree species. Buildings painted with red ochre peeking out here and there are sure to catch your eye. The authentic archipelago atmosphere is perfect for enjoying a summer's day.

Get to know Särkisalo on a day trip

Särkisalo consists of a small strip of land and numerous islands. There are places worth visiting on all the bigger islands. Go on a day trip by car, boar, kayak or even bicycle. Indeed, the road from the mainland to Pettu is part of the Coastal Route. When you leave from the mainland, you will first arrive at Isoluoto, from where the road will take you through the Niksaari and Ulkoluoto islands to the Pettu island. You also get to enjoy a short trip on the sea along the route, as a ferry operates between Pettu and Ulkoluoto.

You can also explore Särkisalo by foot. The Liars' Benches located along nature trails in Särkisalo are great for taking a break and stopping for a chat. The benches are the result of the villagers' joint effort and will be placed outside in May. The rumour is that a tall tale or two may have been told on the benches now and then. Many of the benches are located by the sea. Sit down to look what the birds are doing or watch the boats passing by. Tourists are pampered in Särkisalo: there is lots to do, including charter cruises, canoeing trips, kayaking rentals and tailored fishing trips as well as instructed yoga classes on the beach and saunas for rent. There are many places for getting a meal and a cup of coffee, and you can watch the sunset at the end of the day from the terraces or a rock with great views to the surrounding nature. If you want to experience more, you can rent a cabin.

Summer season culminates with the Night of the Ancient Bonfires

The atmospheric Night of the Ancient Bonfires brings together cottage dwellers and island inhabitants on Saturday 26 August. Events are organised around Särkisalo, including in the village centre area, Förby, and Niksaari. Just like in previous years, many of the summer restaurants in Särkisalo offer live music, fire shows and fireworks. The celebration dates back to a time when seafarers were guided to land using beacon fires lit on the shore.

Delicacies and a great atmosphere at the Baltic Herring Festival

Särkisalo, once known as a fishing village, is naturally also known for its great fishing waters. Fishing continues to be popular in the area. The Baltic Herring Festival organised at the Tiirantori square is centred around locally fished herrings that are guaranteed to be fresh and fished by the local Meripirtti club, which also organises the event. At the Baltic Herring Festival, both locals and visitors get to exchange pleasantries in a joyful market atmosphere. Pastries, crafts and farmers' products are also sold at the event. Everyone is welcome to visit the Baltic Herring Festival on 14 October at 11 a.m.–2 p.m.

Uskela Church

The Uskela Church is located on a high hill. A small stone church belonging to the chapel parish of Salo had been built there in 1440. This chapel of Saint Anna was later demolished and its stones were used to build the new church. The church that stands in the location today was completed in 1832 and was designed by C.L. Engel, who was the most-well known architect of his time.



Teijo Church

Located in the Teijo Ironworks, Teijo Church is Finland's smallest stone church. The master of the Teijo Ironworks, the ironmaster Robert Bremer, commissioned this stone church resembling a Chinese pagoda in 1829.

Halikko Church

The Halikko Church was completed around 1440. The church is dedicated to Bridget of Sweden. In the early 19th century, the twonave rectangular church was transformed into a cross-shaped church.



The Church of Saint Lawrence

This grey granite church located in Perniö and dedicated to Saint Lawrence was built in the 15th century, during the Middle Ages. The vaults of the three-naved church are covered with paintings dating back to late 15th century.

Salo has a number of outdoor gyms. Read more at salo.fi/ulkokuntoilulaitteet. The exercise area and Pahkavuori disc golf course at Uskela school are just a short walk from the Sports Park. Salo has 9 disc golf courses, with more on the way.

Salo Sports Park also has a popular playground, Family Park. Out of all the playgrounds in Salo, Family Park offers the most variety. Climb high on Family Park's climbing frames and imagine you are a superhero. Spin yourself dizzy or reach for the sky in the swings. Make music, build a sand castle or have a picnic break. The fenced park area has toilet facilities and an accessible play area designed to suit the needs of persons with disabilities or impaired vision.

Salo Swimming Pool has a 30-metre water slide, a cold pool and diving towers (1.3 and 5 metres) which attract children and adolescents to the well-lit swimming centre and its wide variety of activities. The youngest members of the family have their own 30-degree kids' pool, where they can play with water toys and slide down a kid-sized water slide. The swimming pool organises kids' activities and water gymnastics which are open to all. There are heated therapeutic and recreational pools with massaging water jet stations, as well as two 25-metre pools. In front of the swimming pool, you can admire an impressive work of art, namely Pekka Jylhä's Joy, a gigantic and colourful beach ball.

Coastal Route – Cycling Trail

Salo – Teijo Ironworks Villages – Kemiönsaari – Hanko – Raasepori – Salo (over 200 kilometres)

Hop on a bike and pedal your way from Salo to the archipelago.

The Coastal Route starts from Salo and continues to Teijo National Park through three ironworks villages: Kirjakkala, Teijo and Mathildedal. The Coastal Route has been expanded, so you can also stop in the maritime Särkisalo and enjoy the atmosphere of idyllic summer cafés. The route continues via Strömma channel to Kemiönsaari's islands, and all the way to Kasnäs.

From Kasnäs, you can take an inter-island ferry to the villages of Rosala and Hiittinen, or visit the island of Högsåra. You can also continue your journey to the fortress island of Örö, where you can explore the area on your bike. It is also possible to travel by sea from Kasnäs to Hanko and continue your bike ride to Tammisaari. From Tammisaari, you can head north and return to Salo that way. The total length of the route is over 200 km. It is easy to rent a bike along the way. Additional information on bike rentals: **www.rannikkoreitti.fi**

Salo – Halikko – Kemiönsaari – Teijo Ironworks Villages – Salo (approx. 90 kilometres)

Have fun while biking along the maritime Little Coastal Route. The highlights of this route are the idyllic ironworks villages, beautiful views and delicious food.

Hop on a bike and get to know Salo on a route that leaves from central Salo and takes you through gorgeous seaside landscapes. Stop for a refreshing swim, feast at the local restaurants, and rest in one of the lodgings along the way.

The Kokkila ferry takes you to Kemiönsaari island where freedom and the smell of the sea are present all year round. Walk on the cliffs, smoothed down by the sea, and enjoy the fresh sea breeze before continuing to the award-winning, idyllic ironworks villages in the Teijo region.

The ironworks villages offer much to see and do throughout the year. First, you will encounter the lively Mathildedal, followed by scenic Teijo and appealing Kirjakkala. Park your bike and enjoy the warm atmosphere of the villages with some food and beverages. Kirjakkala, located between the sea and lakes, offers access to the trails, activities and nature experiences of Teijo National Park.

Ironworks Villages and Idyllic Countryside: Bicycle Trail

Explore Salo's diversity on a bike. The journey consists of archipelago views, idyllic villages, and wonderful nature, and it's best enjoyed on a leisurely bike ride.

The journey proceeds slowly, and there is no rush to get to the next destination. Stop for a refreshing break on one of Salo's best beaches at lake Lehmijärvi, or get to know the highland cattle on Leipyöli farm amid Perniö's river views. Leipyöli also offers bike-friendly accommodation and various activities.

Särkisalo welcomes you with gorgeous nature and a maritime atmosphere. Enjoy the nature experiences, excellent food and gorgeous sunsets. A ferry will take you from Ulkoluoto to Pettu, which is the outermost inhabited island of the archipelago village. Särkisalo is also known for its rich fishing waters, and many of the area's entrepreneurs offer fishing services.

You will also get to experience the charming Teijo ironworks villages which will easily take you a day or two to explore. The villages offer unforgettable experiences, such as local food and spectacular nature

The first one to welcome you is the cheery Mathildedal with its culinary treats and unique products. Teijo ironworks village offers experiences for those interested in history, culture and exercise. The last stop is the Kirjakkala ironworks village, where you have an opportunity to admire the wonderful nature around lake Hamarinjärvi.

Journey of Flavours in Salo: Car Tour

Take a trip for the taste buds around the delicious Salo region and fall in love with the region's cafés, restaurants, breweries and bakeries. Foodies can enjoy local foods and drinks throughout the entire route.

Grab snacks from the vast selection available at the Salo marketplace, hop in a car, and start your tour to explore the delicacies available in the Salo region. On this trip, you will enjoy slow days in idyllic cafés and unique restaurants that prepare tasty experiences from local ingredients in season. You will also get to enjoy local food purchased from farm shops, freshly brewed coffee, and locally made apple juice and cider. Beer brewed in Salo's villages and delicacies from our bakeries are excellent souvenirs.

In addition to mouth-watering food, the route contains numerous cute small shops as well as high-quality accommodation and interesting events. Get to know the award-winning villages in Salo or visit Teijo National Park to enjoy nature all year round. After this journey, you will return home with a good mood and locally produced delicacies and souvenirs.



On a hike

Hiking Trail Salo-Lehmijärvi-Teijo National Park

You can hike or mountain bike the guided route from central Salo all the way to Kirjakkala in Teijo National Park.

The trail runs in field and forest landscapes on cycling roads, gravel roads, forest roads and paths. Among other things, you will find a lean-to shelter, a scenic viewpoint and a historical trail (the route via Viitankruunu) along the route. In the summer, the Lehmijärvi beach has a sauna and a kiosk. The starting points are close to the services in central Salo and Kirjakkala ironworks village.

The total length of the trail is 21 kilometres (a hike takes around 5 hours and a mountain biking tour around 1.5 hours). Due to its height variations and length, the hiking trail is an intermediate trail suitable for people with a good level of fitness with no mobility restrictions. The trail is not maintained during winter. See our other hiking trails on page 23 and our nature trails on the next two pages.

In a canoe

Archipelago Tour of Maritime Salo

Enjoy paddling on a canoe route that offers plenty to see and experience for an active water explorer.

The route is nearly 95 kilometres long and starts at the heart of Salo. On your way, you will find plenty of services. Vuohensaari has a camping area as well as café and restaurant services, while Kaisaari and Isoholma in Teijo National Park have lean-to shelters, campfires and outside toilets.

Stop on the islands of Särkisalo in southern Salo to enjoy the area's hospitality, gorgeous nature and maritime atmosphere. In Särkisalo, you will find rental cottages, restaurants and cafés, as well as an outstanding setting for a variety of activities. The region is known for its good fishing waters, and many of the region's tourism operators offer fishing services. On your way to the region, you can make a stop to enjoy the versatile Mathildedal ironworks village.

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Nature tourism

In addition to Teijo National Park, Salo has many excellent hiking destinations where you can explore our cultural history and nature. The ancient and cultural trails tell the history of the early settlers in the area. Explore the life of birds and plants and the landscape, formed by the Ice Age, on our nature paths and around rapids. The hiking paths and nature surroundings are constantly developed, and accessibility has also been improved. Latokartanonkoski Nature Trail

Located on the Kiskonjoki River in Perniö, Salo, the Latokartanonkoski Rapids are the most impressive whitewater area in Southern Finland. The frothing rush of the rapids is breath-taking, particularly during the spring and autumn floods. Latonkartanonkoski has many signs of earlier settlements from different centuries. The rapids have powered mills, sawmills, ironworks, tilt mills and distilleries. The area is home to various animals and even endangered species, including otters, bats, mussels, European dippers, and salmon fish. The nature trails run through the nature conservation area and partially on private land, forming a 2.2-kilometre long medium-difficulty trail, which is ideally suited for a short day trip. The trail takes approximately 40 minutes to walk, and you can find information on the history and nature of the area posted along the way. The trail starts from the parking area at the end of the road that turns from Hästöntie 140. Experience the majestic power of these beautiful rapids!

Halikonlahti Accessible Path

Viurilanlahti is a highly valuable destination for birdwatching. The place has been a well-known birdwatching location ever since the 1800s. The Halikonlahti section of the birdwatching trail has been developed to make it more accessible. The accessible trail passes through beautiful landscape on the shores of Viurilanlahti, going around the sediment basin of the local waste water management plant. The 1.9-kilometre path is on level ground and is mostly covered with crushed stone fines. It is accessible with a wheelchair, rolling walker as well as a baby carriage. There is also an accessible birdwatching platform along the route, located between two birdwatching towers. The trail is not maintained during winter.

The accessible path starts at Satamakatu 49, Salo.

Bergvik Nature Trail

The Bergvik nature trail is located on the Bergvik Manor grounds, 18 kilometres towards Helsinki from the Salo city centre. There are two marked routes to choose from, approximately 3 and 5 kilometres in length. There is a lean-to shelter and information boards along the nature trail. The Bergvik forests are maintained in accordance with the forest management plan prepared by the Forest Centre of Southwest Finland. When using the nature trail, visitors will be able to pick berries and mushrooms (when available), and enjoy the wonderful diversity of nature. There is no winter maintenance on the trail. Alongside your nature trip, you can also spend the night, eat, drink, bathe in the sauna and go for swims at the Bergvik Manor around the year. The nature path starts at Bergvikintie 43, Salo.

Märvnummi Hiking Trail

The terrain of the Märynummi hiking trail varies widely. This trail is suitable for fit hikers who like versatile trails. There are forest paths, bogs, rock areas and roads along the trail. The length of the marked trail section is just over 5 km. The trail starts at the parking area, just outside the Märynummi town centre. Hirvitie 96. Next to the starting point of the hiking trail, there is also an 18-channel disc golf course.

Rikala Ancient Path and Linnamäki

On the ancient trail of Rikalanmäki and Linnamäki in Halikko, you will be able to familiarise yourself with the history of the region, particularly the Iron Age, but also newer and older periods. In addition to ancient ruins, visitors can explore cultural vegetation along the trail. The Rikalanmäki section of the ancient trail is 400 metres long, and the total length including the section in Linnamäki is approximately 2.5 kilometres. The Rikalanmäki section of the trail is easy, while the part in Linnamäki is demanding. The destination is well-suited for people of different ages. The ancient path's parking area is located at Rikalantie 77.

Vaisakko Grove and Nature Trail

Bordered by Viurilanlahti Bay, the Vaisakko Nature Reserve on the western shore of Halikonlahti Bay is composed of typical rocky forests interspersed with groves. The area's hardwood forests and massive oaks are unique and home to many rare fungi and lichen species. Vaisakko is at its best in springtime when the anemones bloom. www.luontoon.fi/vaisakko

Viitankruunu Historical Trail and Viitanpolku Trail

The historical site in Viitankruunu contains three large burial mounds dating back to the Bronze Age. The burial mounds offer an magnificent view over Halikonlahti Bay. There is a parking area at the start of the trail (Merikulmantie 259). During 2021, a new outdoor trail of around 670 metres was constructed in Viitannummenpuisto Park. The trail starts at the end of Reikäkirveenkatu and provides access to the shore of Halikonlahti Bay without having to walk across the residential area. The trail's special features include a wooden bridge approximately 90 metres in length. There is a lean-to shelter along Viitanpolku Trail.

Hyyppärä Path and Kultalähde Spring

The nature trail (total length 1.8/2.3 kilometres) travels along a roller coaster-like forest path network on top of Hyyppärä ridge, rising to the top of steep hillocks and descending to the bottom of kettle holes. You will find the beautiful and mystical Kultalähde Spring on the northern edge of the path. The nature path is demanding and suitable for fit people of all ages, but not for those with reduced mobility.

The car park by the starting point is at Oinasjärventie 36. Download a brochure from www.salo.fi/retkeilykohteet

Vuohensaari Nature Trail

The island of Vuohensaari is located in Halikonlahti Bay, a few kilometres from the city centre. Today, Vuohensaari is an idyllic area for recreation. The Vuohensaari nature trail starts right by the parking area, and the path of approximately one kilometre is marked with vertical squares on the trees. Use the QR codes provided along the trail to read information about the history of the area.

Back to Salo

Jonna Saari moved back to Salo after spending eight years in Lapland. Salo's diverse nature and versatile hiking destinations appeal to Jonna. 0

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Jonna Saari's return to Salo was a sum of many parts. While Saari and her partner continued to have love for Lapland, they were looking to turn a new page in their lives. The uncertainty brought by the pandemic and the fact that their safety nets were located far away also influenced their decision.

– Our daily lives were wonderful in Lapland, but we had no safety nets there and lived far from any services. The distance to the nearest shop was 30 kilometres and to the health centre 50 kilometres, Saari explains. Saari moved to Salo with her partner in June 2022. Now, the couple lives in the Kurkela neighbourhood of Kisko, Salo, in an old detached house that used to belong to Saari's grandparents.

 Here, we can continue the same peaceful lifestyle we led in Lapland, as Salo has such an extensive and peaceful rural area. Despite this, services are located nearby. We're a bit reclusive, so this suits us well, Jonna says and smiles.

Esker landscape and green groves

For Saari, nature is a respite and a lifeline. What appeals to her in Salo are the area's diverse nature and varying terrain. There are highlands covered by pine forest, verdant groves, lakes and ponds as well as esker landscapes and the archipelago.

– Having a national park right here in Salo is obviously a huge luxury, but there's also a lot more to see in the area. There are enough places to explore to last a lifetime in Salo and its neighbouring municipalities. Just grab a map and see what you can find here, Saari encourages. Saari likes to spend her leisure time wandering in nature. Her favourite destinations include the Vaisakko Nature Reserve and Hyyppärä esker, the home of the Kultalähde spring, one of the most remarkable springs in Southern Finland.

 The esker landscape with all its forests is a sight to behold. The Vaisakko grove has a great atmosphere and has massive, awe-inspiring trees.

Watching the Milky Way and visiting flea markets

The Pohjan-Kisko lake highlands is another of Saari's favourite nature destinations. This forest area embellished by lakes, ponds and rocks is great for camping. The area is also apt for watching the Milky Way on dark winter's nights.

– With all the light pollution these days, getting to see the Milky way is invaluable. You can see it so clearly from the Pohjan-Kisko highlands that it boggles the mind. I highly recommend enjoying this gorgeous wintry sight, Saari notes.

In addition to enjoying the nature destinations, Saari also encourages visitors to discover Salo's flea markets. As an avid flea market goer, Saari has noticed that Salo is an excellent destination for second hand shop enthusiasts. Flea markets in Salo include Kirppis Aarresaari, Radiokirppis and the Next Level Second Hand Shop.

– We have amazing flea markets around here. The distance to Salo from Turku and Helsinki is short, and the best thing is that parking costs nothing here.
