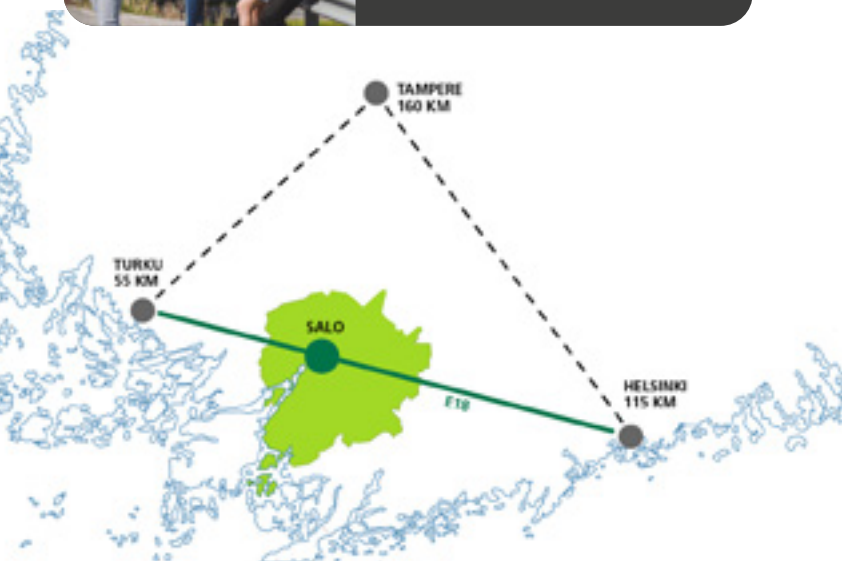

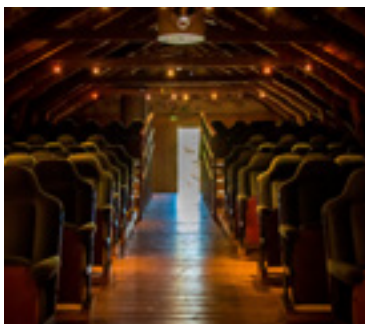

27.1.–28.4.2024 Chen Jiagang

Photographer and architect **Chen Jiagang's** images combine hypnotic depictions of the Chinese countryside, the factories and marketplaces of megacities, industrial architecture and still-life human figures. The large photographs open up vast landscapes, revealing the immense proportions of a special kind of nature and, at the same time, the human handprint left there. Chen's work conveys a reflection on the relationship between history and the present and, through this, a concern for the future.

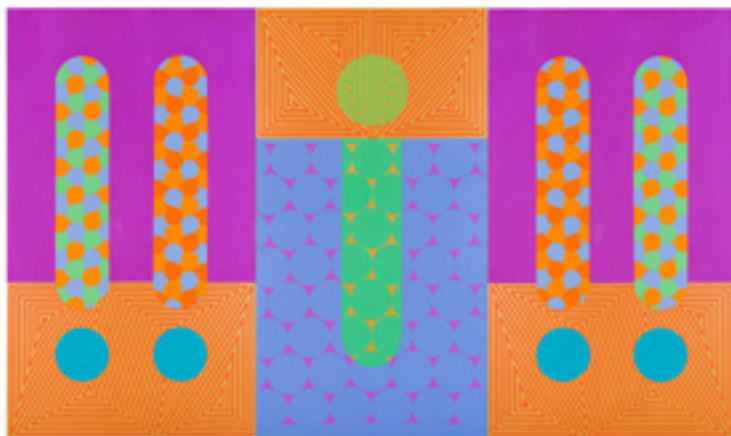
The landscapes and interiors Chen depicts are reminiscent of large, scenery-laden stages. The artist's works are delicate in tone and still in movement, creating a roman-

tic and dreamlike atmosphere. The attention is drawn to women dressed in traditional Chinese costumes. They are carefully positioned and many of them look directly at the camera. But the seemingly still moment has actually not stood still at all, as people, seasons and times of day move and change. The multi-layered images are like modern China in miniature.

Chen Jiagang, born in 1962 in Chongqing, was originally trained as an architect. Since 1999, Chen has become known as a photographer in both private and group exhibitions around the world in Asia, Europe and the United States. Chen Jiagang currently lives and works in Beijing.

18.5.–1.9.2024 Mari Rantanen

In summer, the halls of Salo Art Museum Veturitalli will be filled with the glowingly colourful works of Stockholm-based visual artist, Professor **Mari Rantanen** (born 1956). Helsinki, Tammela, New York and Stockholm have all been important bases for the international artist. Rantanen's work has not been exhibited in Finland for ten years. Her latest paintings and prints from the last few years will be on display in Salo. Both the Renaissance church ornaments and the phenomena of contemporary art act as sources of inspiration for Rantanen, who has had a long career in visual art.

27.1.–28.4.2024 Nuutti Koskinen: Primary Succession

Visual artist **Nuutti Koskinen's** (born 1975) two-channel video installation *Primary Succession* (2023), tells the story of the relationship between archipelago nature and humans. The work deals with the infrastructure of representing, experiencing and shaping nature.

18.5.–1.9.2024 Eevi Rutanen

In her work, visual artist **Eevi Rutanen** (born 1992) explores the relationship between home and technology. In her kinetic installations, objects familiar from everyday chores become strange as they are brought to life in unexpected ways. The artist aims to challenge assumptions about technology and the role of the home using playfulness and humour.

Made in Salo Exhibition

**See a vast number of old telephones, radios and
televisions in one place!**

The Made in Salo exhibition of the Salo Electronics Museum sheds light on the development and transformation of communications, the related devices and the electronics industry from the end of the 1920s to the modern day. The exhibition particularly showcases radios, televisions, radiophones and mobile phones and monitors designed and manufactured in Salo. The museum displays products designed and manufactured by Salora, Mobira, Nokia and Benefon, as well as production equipment from over the course of more than 90 years. In the museum, you can also get to know devices manufactured by newer electronics companies from Salo.

The Salo Electronics Museum is a visiting destination for the whole family, with interesting content for people of all ages. In the museum, you can watch clips of old television programmes and listen to radio programmes from the late 1920s onwards. You can use a landline phone and order a call through a manual switchboard. You can try your hand at old video games. See if you can find your first Nokia telephone from among the exhibition.

LOCAL MUSEUMS

Halikko Museum, Kirkkorinne 7, Halikko

Halikko Museum is located near Halikko Church, in a sturdy stone granary completed in 1849. This former granary illustrates the history of Halikko region on three floors through farming and craft occupations. The museum also displays the Count Armfelt weapons collection and has an exhibition depicting life and history at the Halikko district mental hospital.

Kiikala Local History Museum, Porvarinpolku 10, Kiikala

The museum grounds have seven buildings that have been moved there from around Kiikala. The museum has an extensive collection of traditional peasant artefacts, items from the Kiikala pharmacy and products from the Johannislund glass factory.

Kreivnmäki Outdoor Museum, Viurilantie 34, 24910 Halikko

On top of a high hill, a smock mill dating back to the 1800s still stands on its original location. The mill was originally the property of the Vuorentaka Manor. The area also includes loft storehouse and granary as well as a miller's croft from the 1700s. The croft is private property. The museum area can be freely explored all year round.

Meritalo Museum, Moisioinkatu 18, Salo

Meritalo has been serving as a museum for 50 years. The museum is located in the centre of the old Salo, in the Moisio neighbourhood. The atmospheric former school building showcases a classroom as well as an apartment of a teacher family from the late 19th, early 20th century. Refresh yourself in the lush museum garden and familiarise yourself with old, traditional plants. You can also visit the garden outside the museum's opening hours. The joyful Entten tentten ("Eeny, meeny") exhibition takes visitors to the happy world of play and toys.

Perniö Museum, Museotie 9, Perniö

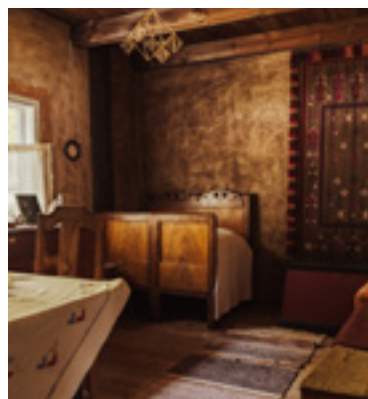
The exhibition in the museum completed in 1930 showcases the rich history of Perniö region and life in the area. A new changing exhibition, Perniöön ja takaisin – sukumme naiskohtaloita ("To Perniö and Back Again – the fates of women in our family"), is open at the museum, telling the interesting story of visual artist Aurora Reinhart and her mother, ceramic artist Catharina Kajander.

Suomusjärvi Local History Museum, Karjalohjantie 161–2, Suomusjärvi

An atmospheric wooden granary located next to the Suomusjärvi Church exhibits local peasant culture, tools of craftsmen, church artefacts and prehistorical discoveries as well as a special curiosity, a miraculous perpetual motion machine.

Trömperi Inn, Vanha Turuntie 1326, Hajala

The idyllic Trömperi is located along the Kuninkaantie road and has attracted many a traveller to come and rest within its walls over the years. According to legend, counts and royalty used to visit the Trömperi inn on their hunting and fishing trips. The building was owned by the same family all the way until 1971, at which point the buildings and all their items were bequeathed to museum use. Trömperi is protected under the Act on the Protection of the Built Heritage. A cosy summer café operates in the museum during its opening hours and the museum organises lots of events during the summer.



Local Museums of the Salo Historical Museum SAMU

In addition to Salo Electronics Museum, Salo Historical Museum SAMU comprises seven local museums in the greater Salo region.

The local museums are primarily open in the summer and at other times upon agreement. All local museums have free entry during the opening hours.

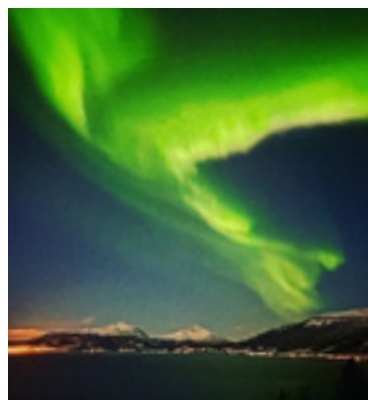

Teijo National Park

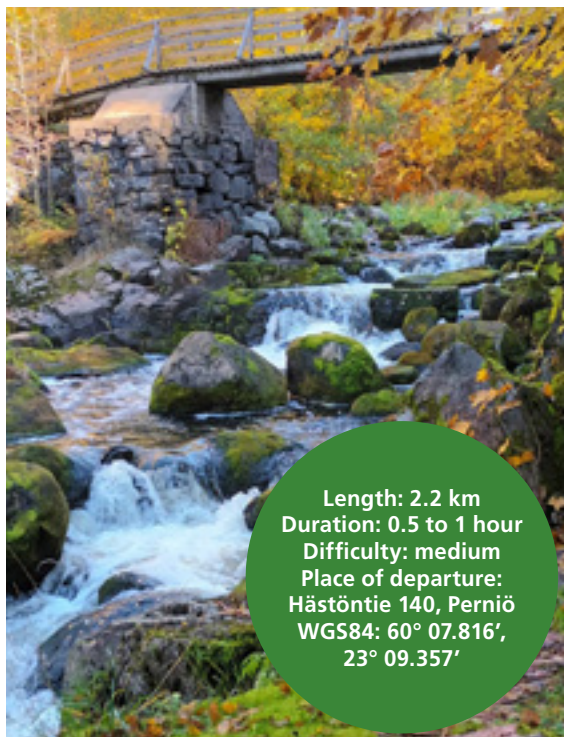
Located right next to the Teijo ironworks villages, Teijo National Park provides an opportunity to experience the diverse Finnish nature. The landscapes range from peaty forests to mires, groves and cliffs. The mosaic of lakes and proximity to the sea are also part of Teijo's atmosphere. The dammed lakes and coal pits found in the terrain reflect the history of the ironworks villages.

Teijo offers up to 50 kilometres of well-marked hiking trails. Some of the trails have been built to be accessible for wheelchair users and pedestrians with prams.

The most popular trail in the national park runs around Matildanjärvi lake (5.5 kilometres). The specialities of the Sahajärvi trail (8.8 kilometres) are its two manually pulled ferries. Totti nature trail (1.3 kilometres) and Muurahaispolku trail (1.3 kilometres) are well-suited, comfortable nature trails for families with children.

We recommend starting the excursion from the Teijo Visitor Centre south of Lake Matildanjärvi. At the Visitor Centre, you can get tips and maps for your trip. The entrepreneur-led Visitor Centre also has a café and an equipment rental company. Matildanjärvi lake is a recreational and fishing destination. Rent a canoe, kayak, rowing boat or SUP board and experience Matildanjärvi lake from a new perspective. The area also has trails for mountain bikers.

Latokartanonkoski Rapids

Surging rapids, lush shore groves and interesting history. Latokartanonkoski is an excellent hiking destination for the whole family.

The history of the Latokartano mill extends to the Middle Ages, and is part of a significant built cultural environment. The current mill ceased its operations in the 1960s.

The spectacular rapids also attract rare birds to fish on its shores. Spot the white-throated dipper or a kingfisher. For humans, the rapids are a recreational fishing destination run by the Finnish Forest and Park Service, which means that fishing is subject to a permit.

The nature trail consists of the basic trail marked in yellow, and green dead ends. Although the nature trail is demanding in places and contains stairs, the trail is also suitable for walking with a pram up to the ruins of the mill.

Halikonlahti Bay

Bird trail

The Halikonlahti Bay is an important bird wetland during the migration of birds. As many as 110 species of birds can be found in the bay, including rarities. The waders found in the area include the wood sandpiper and the ruddy turnstone.

The Halikonlahti Bay has two birdwatching towers: Timalitorni and Staijitorni, an accessible birdwatching platform and hides. There are two routes in the area: an accessible trail and a bird trail. The accessible trail is suitable for use with assisted wheelchairs or prams.

Vuohensaari

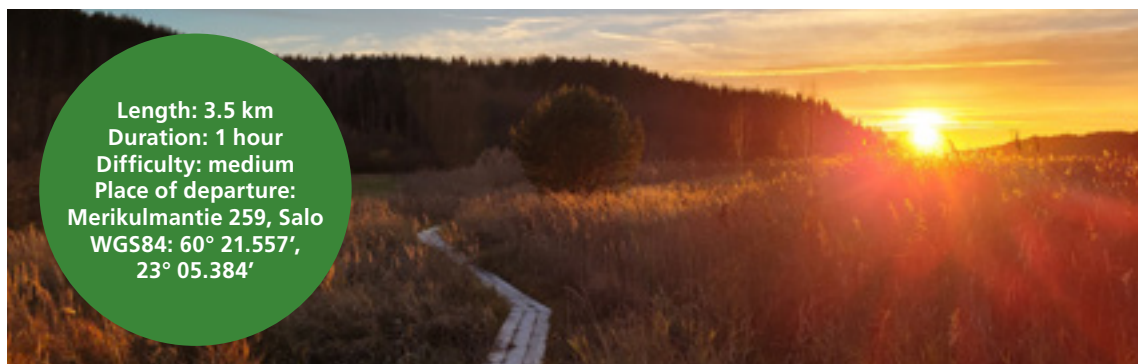
Four kilometres from the centre of Salo is the rugged Vuohensaari Island, which is populated by primeval forests. On the island, you can experience nature, physical activity and culture.

Wiurila Manor donated Vuohensaari as a recreation area for the Salo residents in 1933. Since then, Midsummer festivals and dances have been held on the island.

Vuohensaari nature trails lead hikers to primeval forests, groves, coastal cliffs and historical sites. The nature trail consists of the Kreivi trail (0.9 kilometres) and the related Kippari trail and Torppari trail, the latter of which is suitable for prams.

The island's services also include a camping area, café, summer theatre, swimming place, mini golf course and playground.

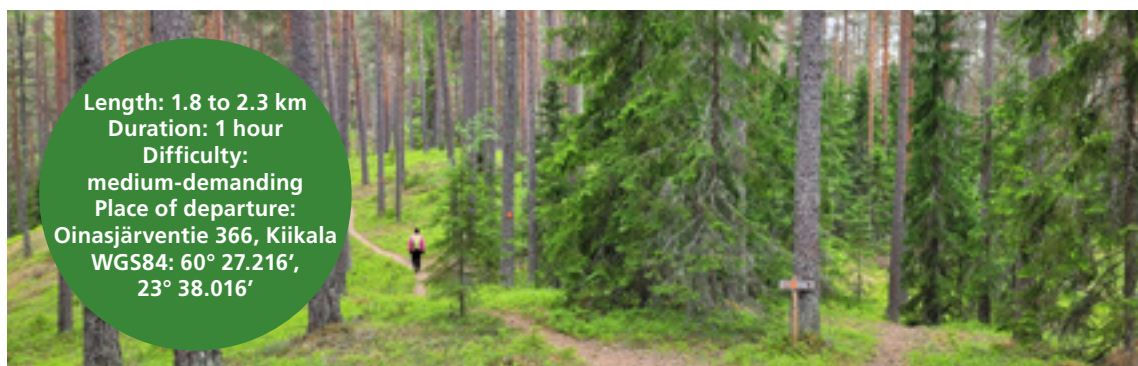

Viitankruunu

The Viitankruunu trail around the Viitannummi residential area surprises hikers with its versatility. The trail, located four kilometres from the market square, contains lush forests, seaside landscapes, duckboards and a sense of timelessness.

The main attraction of the trail is the three impressive, bronze-age burial stones of Viitankruunu. For bird watchers, there is a birdwatching platform on the shore, with a good view of the significant bird bay of Halikonlahti Bay. The lean-to shelter in the area offers a magnificent view of the bay. Please note that if you want to make a fire, you should always check the warnings and bring your own firewood with you.

The Omenalaakso trail (1.6 kilometres) marked in blue tours the easy terrain of the local nature and cycling roads. The Viitanpolku trail section (0.7 kilometres) along the shore of Viitankruunu is also suitable for prams.

Hyypärä

The traces of the Ice Age are strongly visible in Hyypärä. Hyypäränharju, part of Salpausselkä, offers hikers plenty to see, as well as plenty of height differences. The enormous kettle holes and the mysterious Kultalähde spring fascinate hikers. In the tranquil wildernesses, hikers can experience perfect peace and quiet.

Kultalähde spring, found along the trails, is one of the most important springs in southern Finland. The spring, surrounded by endangered plants, must not be circled and fishing is prohibited there.

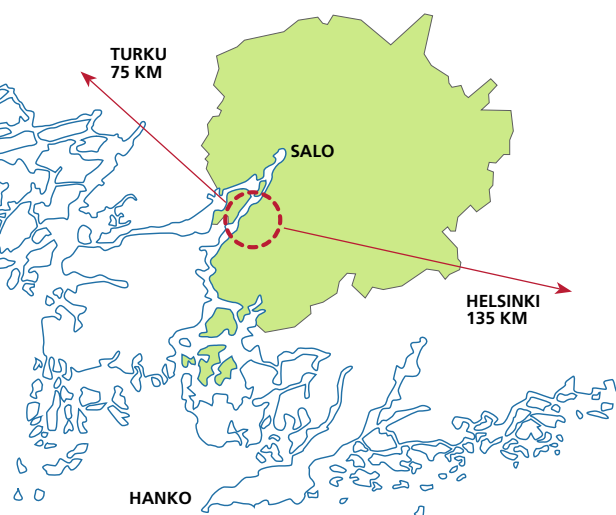
The beautiful needle paths in the area are the most challenging trails in Salo due to their vast height differences. Hikers can choose between the shorter Pikkukierros and a the slightly longer Isokierros.

Teijo National Park and the region's lively ironworks villages

Get enchanted by the peace of nature, go for a hike, paddle, take a dip in the water and continue your trek. Experience a whole range of delightful cultural history at the vibrant ironworks villages where activities are organised around the year.



Nature lovers should definitely visit Teijo National Park. The national park area has in total around 50 kilometres of marked trails. Even on a short trek, you can see stark rocks, lake scenery, peat and forest. The area also has campfire sites, lean-tos and fishing spots.

Three ironworks, Mathildedal, Teijo and Kirjakkala, once operated right next to the Teijo National Park, by the sea. Densely populated village communities formed around the ironworks in the 1600s and 1800s. Today, the villages are a major culture-historical destination combining history, art and craft. The unique atmosphere, versatile leisure time activities and rich culture of the villages draw in visitors from near and far.

Immerse yourself in the history of the ironworks villages at captivating events

In the spring, as nature starts to bloom, Teijon Masuuni will organise **the Ruukki Kukkii – old-timey handicrafts market on 25 May**. This is a great day for getting to know the history of the Teijo ironworks milieu. See vendor booths for craft items and local food as well as summer flowers, saplings and herbs and pop up foods. Teijo Masuuni's high-quality art exhibitions, café and shops are also open. The Teijo Church, Finland's smallest stone-built church, also has an open day.

Get to know the cultural heritage of the Mathildedal Ironworks on the **Ironworks Day 8 June**. Already held for the fourteenth time, the event offers guided ironworks tours, lectures, music, traditional games for children and artisans' market where you can buy local crafts. In the autumn, the historical museum of the Mathildedal Ironworks is turned into the **Ghost Museum** for a little over two

weeks. The scary Ghost Museum includes activities for the whole family and is open every day from 12 to 27 October. Lights, music and props are used to create a special atmosphere to the museum.

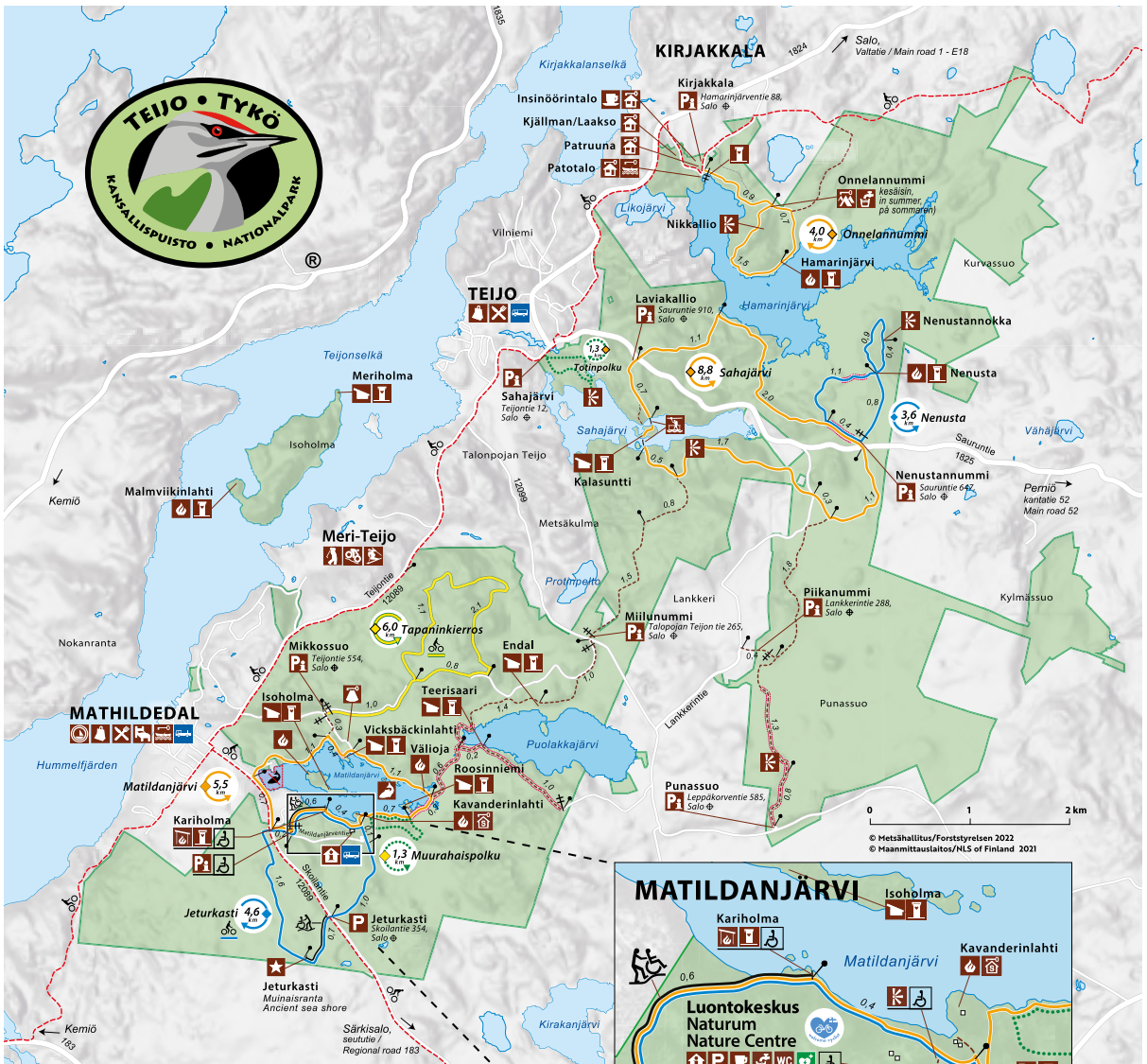
Hustle and bustle meets the peace of nature

There is plenty to see and experience at the ironworks villages. Its cafés, restaurants, shops and museums welcome all visitors. The art exhibitions at Teijon Masuuni are open year-round with the exception of midwinter. Free admission. See summer theatre performances and experience live music at the Mathildedal Ironworks Village, for example in the Mathildan Marina and village restaurant Terho. There is yoga on the pier and singing bowl relaxation exercises at Mathildan Marina every Wednesday from 26 June to 7 August. Ironwork villages prepare for Christmas

Get a head start on Christmas at the ironworks village Christmas market. Try tasty treats and buy high-quality crafts and food products from local producers. The **Mathildedal Christmas Market** will take place between November-December. During the event, the whole Mathildedal village is decorated for Christmas and all the shops, cafés and restaurants are open. Come over to shop, enjoy a Christmas meal or try traditional rise porridge. Christmas-themed activities are organised for children. You can also get Belgian hot chocolate, which has become a huge hit, at the market. You'll find enough things to spend the whole day at the outdoor event so you better dress warmly.

You can also experience enchanted Christmas at the artisans' Christmas market organised by Teijon Masuuni. The two-day **Teijon Masuuni Christmas Market** is held on 30 November–1 December at 11 a.m.–4 p.m. The market is organised in heated indoor spaces and an atmospheric yard of the idyllic Teijo ironworks milieu. Artisans and their products play the main role at the market. The Christmas Market provides a great way to support Finnish crafts and local production by buying high-quality hand-made products to give as Christmas presents and decorate your home with straight from the makers. The art exhibitions, café, art and crafts shop and other shops of Teijon Masuuni are also open during the event.

Teijo National Park offers a fantastic setting with its trails, mushrooms and berries, beaches and campfire sites.

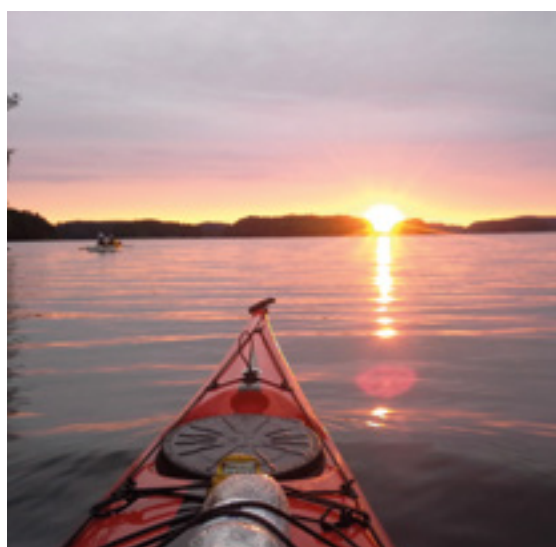
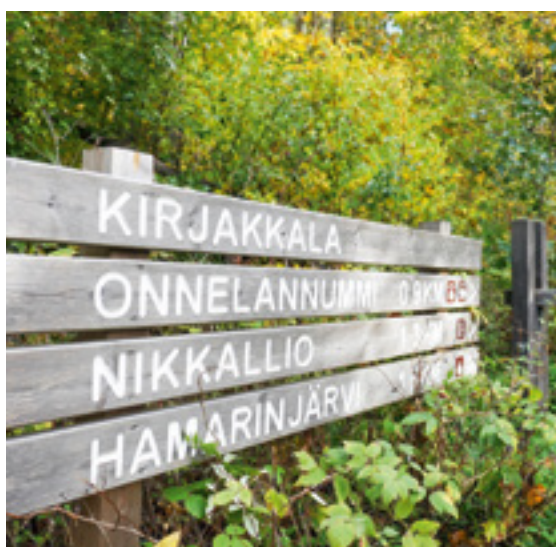

Onnelannummi trail 4 kilometres / 1.5–2.5 hours

The trail starts near Kirjakkala village. After walking for less than one kilometre, you will reach the Onnelannummi pine heath with its reservable camping area available for groups.

Signs then lead you on from Onnelannummi to the Hamarijärvi campfire site, which is a perfect place to take a break and admire the peace and quiet of Lake Hamarijärvi.

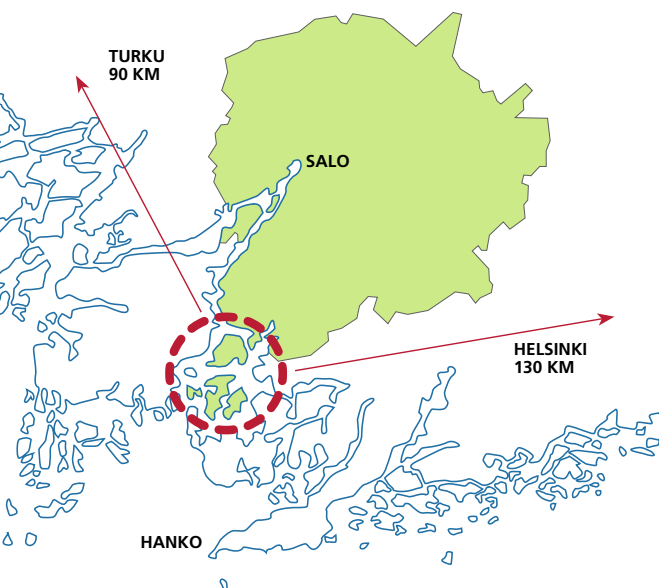

Easy archipelago life in Särkisalo

The sea, beaches, guest harbours and cliffs with gorgeous views and idyllic summer cafés and restaurants make Särkisalo the perfect holiday destination for anyone who loves to spend time in the archipelago. There is plenty to do and see until late autumn, when the traditional Baltic Herring Festival takes place.





Summer is a vibrant time in Särkisalo, the southernmost point of Salo. This is when the area's number of inhabitants grows four-fold as those with summer cottages come to spend time in their holiday dwellings. The harbors are also filled with boats. Visitors can enjoy local delicacies on the terraces of summer cafés and restaurants in a beautiful nature scenery. Särkisalo is surrounded by the sea and the area has diverse tree species. Buildings painted with red ochre peeking out here and there are sure to catch your eye. The authentic archipelago atmosphere is perfect for enjoying a summer's day.

Get to know Särkisalo on a day trip

Särkisalo consists of a small strip of land and numerous islands. There are places worth visiting on all the bigger islands. Go on a day trip by car, boat, kayak or even bicycle. Indeed, the road from the mainland to Pettu is part of the Coastal Route. When you leave from the mainland, you will first arrive at Isoluoto, from where the road will take you through the Niksaari and Ulkoluoto islands to the Pettu island. You also get to enjoy a short trip on the sea along the route, as a ferry operates between Pettu and Ulkoluoto.

You can also explore Särkisalo by foot. The Liars' Benches located along nature trails in Särkisalo are great for taking a break and stopping for a chat. The benches are the result of the villagers' joint effort and will be placed outside in May. The rumour is that a tall tale or two may have been told on the benches now and then. Many of the benches are located by the sea. Sit down to look what the birds are doing or watch the boats passing by. Tourists are pampered in Särkisalo: there is lots to do, including charter



cruises, canoeing trips, kayaking rentals and tailored fishing trips as well as instructed yoga classes on the beach and saunas for rent.

There are many places for getting a meal and a cup of coffee, and you can watch the sunset at the end of the day from the terraces or a rock with great views to the surrounding nature. If you want to experience more, you can rent a cabin.

Summer season culminates with the Night of the Ancient Bonfires

The atmospheric Night of the Ancient Bonfires brings together cottage dwellers and island inhabitants on Saturday 31 August. Events are organised around Särkisalo, including in the village centre area, Förby, and Niksaari. Just like in previous years, many of the summer restaurants in Särkisalo offer live music, fire shows and fireworks. The celebration dates back to a time when seafarers were guided to land using beacon fires lit on the shore.

Delicacies and a great atmosphere at the Baltic Herring Festival

Särkisalo, once known as a fishing village, is naturally also known for its great fishing waters. Fishing continues to be popular in the area. The Baltic Herring Festival organised at the Tiirantori square is centred around locally fished herrings that are guaranteed to be fresh and fished by the local Meripirtti club, which also organises the event. At the Baltic Herring Festival, both locals and visitors get to exchange pleasantries in a joyful market atmosphere. Pastries, crafts and farmers' products are also sold at the event. Everyone is welcome to visit the Baltic Herring Festival on 12 October at 11 a.m.–2 p.m.

Varikattilanmäki nature trail

Established in 1982, Varikattilanmäki Nature Reserve offers plenty to see: the rocky nature of Southwest Finland, its views and the historical "Russki Oven". The Ice Age has left its marks on the landscape, such as shingle ridges and erratic boulders. The trail leading to Varikattilanmäki (3.2 km) is medium-level. In addition to cliffs, the diverse nature also includes peaty forests and mire woodlands. The Eero Trail (2.6 km) is a much easier outdoor trail than Varikattilankierros. Kuukallio, which is part of the Arttu Nature Reserve, is not as diverse, but is beautiful nonetheless.

Both trails start from the Lehmiraanta Holiday Centre, where you can have a cup of coffee after your excursion. The nearby Lehmijärvi beach is a nice place for a refreshing swim on a hot day.



Delicacies directly from farms

Salo is a treasure trove of local food for anyone who enjoys good food. Locally produced food can be purchased directly from the farms, where visitors can get a taste of honest work with a touch of rural idyll. In many local cafés and restaurants, you can enjoy tasty local food that utilises fine ingredients produced in the region.

Salo is one of Finland's largest food producers. A significant proportion of Finnish bread grain is grown in large fields in the area. The grain farms produce wheat, turnip rape and rye. Outdoor gardens grow outdoor cucumbers, pumpkins and berries. Glasshouses grow tomatoes and cucumber. Many farmers in Salo also grow special plants such as broad beans, sugar beet, spelt and caraway. The residents of Salo have also become enthusiastic about pumpkins, and today, Salo is Finland's largest grower of pumpkins. The pumpkin season peaks at harvest time, when Salo celebrates the Pumpkin Weeks.

The Finnish food culture and old traditions can still be sensed in the Salo area. At the beginning of the time, the proximity of the sea brought with it lively connections to the west. The rich food culture of noble manors and vicarages spread to farms and peasants' kitchens. This led to long traditions and numerous recipes that have been reformed and adapted over the centuries with modern twists.

Genuine cider and outdoor cucumbers

Fruit is also grown in Salo. Local apple groves produce jams, juices and particularly cider from their crops. Four out of the fourteen Finnish farms producing genuine cider are located in Salo. The Finnish genuine cider is made of unpasteurised 100% juice with natural fermentation methods, avoiding additives. Finnish genuine cider can be identified by the SASS marking on the label.

In Finland, the cultivation of the outdoor cucumber is concentrated in the Salo region. The season runs from June to September, and

cucumbers are at their most delicious when fresh, served for example on top of bread, as garnishes, or grated. Outdoor cucumbers are also ideal for storing. You can try pickling cucumbers yourself, for example, by fermenting. Cucumber products from Salo are delivered processed throughout Finland.

Superior animal products

Salo has several animal farms where you can buy beef, as well as organic and wild pasture beef. Poultry farms sell responsibly produced turkey meat, duck meat, duck eggs and hen eggs. Together with Somero, Salo is Finland's largest producer of mutton, sheep's wool and sheepskins.

Why local food?

Choosing Finnish food on your plate is now more important than ever, in order to ensure that Finnish food production and its self-sufficiency can be preserved. Food grown in Finland is not only pure, it is also particularly fresh and nutrient-rich when bought from a local farm. By buying local food, you will skip unnecessary intermediaries, and the producer receives better compensation for their work.

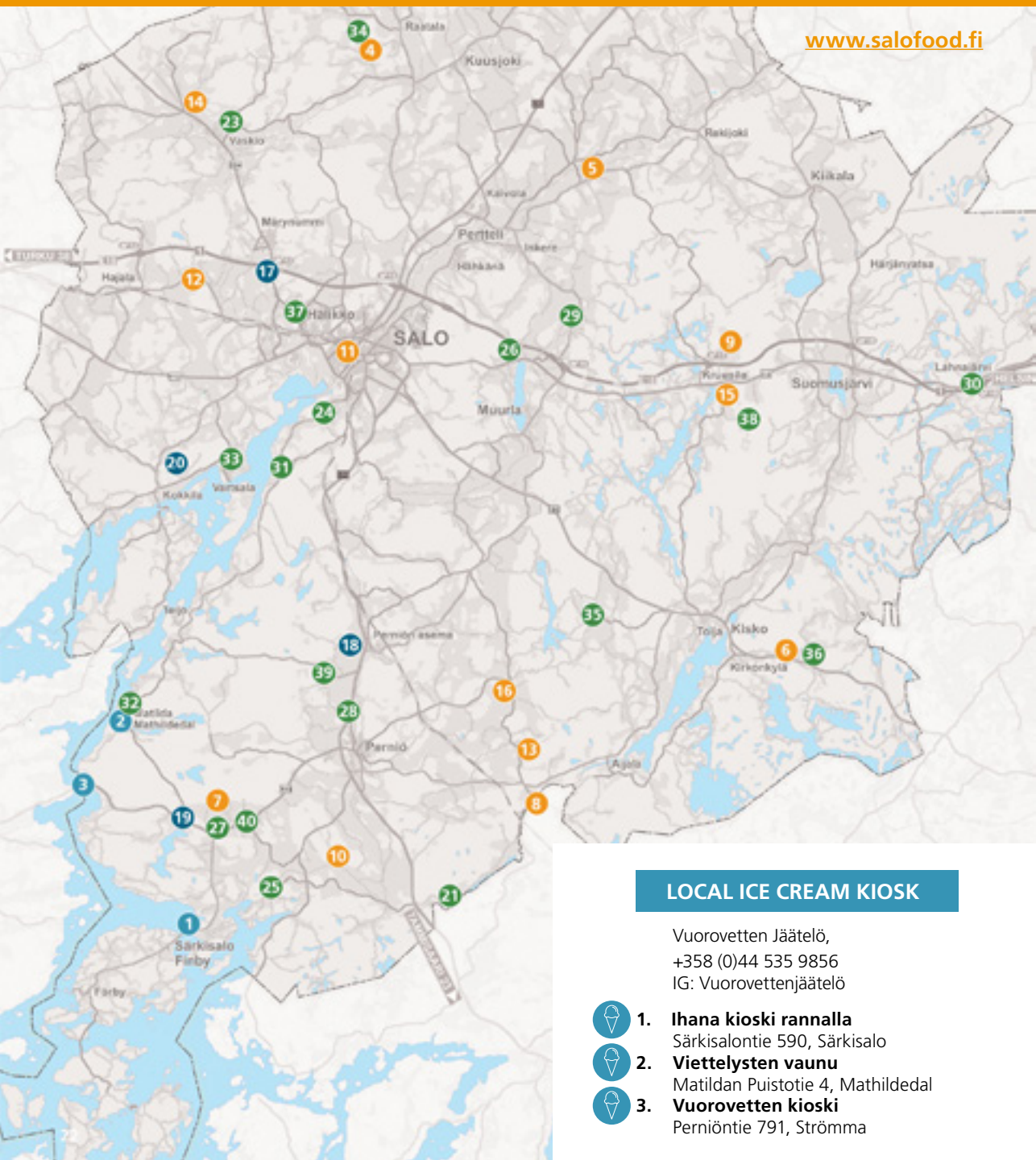

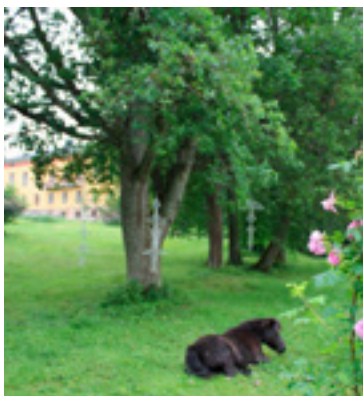

Vaisakko Nature Trail

The Vaisakko grove, one of the most impressive groves in Finland, is an excellent day trip destination for all friends of nature. The nature reserve is at its most beautiful during the spring when the anemones bloom. In the summer, the dense foliage of the trees creates a rainforest-like atmosphere. The colourful autumn foliage of the grove is truly impressive.

Vaisakko's history of crofts is still visible in the heart of the grove. There have been crofting settlements in Vaisakko since the 18th century until 1959.

The Vaisakko Nature Trail consists of an easily accessible gravelled trail, which is also suitable for prams. There is also a spring along this section. The nature reserve starts with narrow duckboards. The grove has a trail that is about 1.5 kilometres long, and which includes stairs and height differences. The Vaisakko cliffs with its impressive seascape offer a perfect place for a picnic.



Rikalanmäki ancient trails

Rikalanmäki's ancient trails offer interesting history and diverse plant species. The history of Rikalanmäki extends up to 4,000 years ago, when the current hill was an island in the sea.

Rikalanmäki was an important hub of trade. The Iron Age finds, as well as the finds that indicate the locations of ancient burial grounds and cremation cemeteries, tell of a long history of habitation in the area. Linnamäki, on the other hand, housed an ancient castle that provided a good defensive position in the late Iron Age.

Rikalanmäki's ancient trails consist of the ancient trails of Rikalanmäki and Linnamäki, and a connecting route between them. The trail is easy, with the exception of the steep trail leading to the top of Linnamäki. Rikala Krouvi offers restaurant and catering services in the area. Rikalanmäki also has the Theatre Provinssi summer theatre.



Lautatarha Nature Trail

In the middle of Vartsala village idyll is the maritime nature trail of Lautatarha. The naturally lush shoreline area is also historically rich, as a sawmill used to operate in the area.

The golden age of the Vartsala sawmill was the first half of the 20th century, when the maritime location made it easy to transport goods also abroad. The sawmill also participated in Finland's war compensation project with the house manufacturing plant located in the area.

There is a log lean-to shelter with beautiful views and a campfire site on the seashore. Remember to bring your own firewood and check the fire weather forecast before lighting a fire. The lean-to shelter is accessible from the Tukkiranta parking area. The middle trail, which runs further away from the shore, is also easy to navigate and gravelled.

Uskela Church

The Uskela Church is located on a high hill. A small stone church belonging to the chapel parish of Salo had been built there in 1440. This chapel of Saint Anna was later demolished and its stones were used to build the new church. The church that stands in the location today was completed in 1832 and was designed by C.L. Engel, who was the most well-known architect of his time.



The Church of Saint Lawrence

This grey granite church located in Perniö and dedicated to Saint Lawrence was built in the 15th century, during the Middle Ages. The vaults of the three-naved church are covered with paintings dating back to late 15th century.



Angelniemi Church

Angelniemi Church was built in 1772 on a beautiful headland in the northern end of Kemiö island. The church is also idyllic for weddings, particularly in summertime.



Teijo Church

Located in the Teijo Ironworks, Teijo Church is Finland's smallest stone church. The master of the Teijo Ironworks, the ironmaster Robert Bremer, commissioned this stone church resembling a Chinese pagoda in 1829.



Halikko Church

The Halikko Church was completed around 1440. The church is dedicated to Bridget of Sweden. In the early 19th century, the two-nave rectangular church was transformed into a cross-shaped church.



Särkisalo Church

The wooden church of Särkisalo was built in 1760. It has a rectangular base and no towers. The church has seating for around 230 people.

Activities in Salo

For golfers, Salo offers three golf courses that meet international standards and have the longest game season in Finland. The Teijo National Park offers things to do for people of all ages, Särkisalo is known for its waters rich in fish, and the Salo Sports Park is an oasis at the heart of the city.

You can enjoy sports and nature round the year on a bike, hike, skis, in a canoe, by swimming, riding horses or downhill driving with a mountain cross cart.



Salo Sports Park is an oasis at the heart of the city

The Sports Park, which is located right off the city centre, offers a wide range of areas for dozens of different sports and fitness activities, both indoors and outdoors. In total, there are nearly 100 hectares reserved for sports and exercising.

Those interested in spectator sports can head to Salohalli (also located in Salo Sports Park) to see top-level games in futsal, basketball and volleyball. In the sports park, you can skateboard on a concrete ramp, swim, ride horses, work out at the outdoor gym, take up athletics, ice skate in the ice hall, ski, golf, bowl, play tennis, padel, basketball or football, do a stair workout and use outdoor gym equipment. Salo has a number of outdoor gyms. Read more at salo.fi/ulkokuntoilulaitteet. The exercise area and Pahkavuori disc golf course at Uskela school are just a short walk from the Sports Park. Salo has 9 disc golf courses, with more on the way.

Salo Sports Park also has a popular playground, Family Park. Out of all the playgrounds in Salo, Family Park offers the most variety. Climb high on Family Park's climbing frames and imagine you are a superhero. Spin yourself dizzy or reach for the sky in the swings. Make music, build a sand castle or have a picnic break. The fenced park area has toilet facilities and an accessible play area designed to suit the needs of persons with disabilities or impaired vision.

Salo Swimming Pool has a 30-metre water slide, a cold pool and diving towers (1, 3 and 5 metres) which attract children and adolescents to the well-lit swimming centre and its wide variety of activities. The youngest members of the family have their own 30-degree kids' pool, where they can play with water toys and slide down a kid-sized water slide. The swimming pool organises kids' activities and water gymnastics which are open to all. There are heated therapeutic and recreational pools with massaging water jet stations, as well as two 25-metre pools. In front of the swimming pool, you can admire an impressive work of art, namely Pekka Jylhä's Joy, a gigantic and colourful beach ball.

Coastal Route – Cycling Trail

Salo – Teijo Ironworks Villages – Kemiönsaari – Hanko – Raasepori – Salo (over 200 kilometres)

Hop on a bike and pedal your way from Salo to the archipelago

The Coastal Route starts from Salo and continues to Teijo National Park through three ironworks villages: Kirjakkala, Teijo and Mathildedal. The Coastal Route has been expanded, so you can also stop in the maritime Särkisalo and enjoy the atmosphere of idyllic summer cafés. The route continues via Strömma channel to Kemiönsaari's islands, and all the way to Kasnäs.

From Kasnäs, you can take an inter-island ferry to the villages of Rosala and Hiittinen, or visit the island of Högsåra. You can also continue your journey to the fortress island of Örö, where you can explore the area on your bike. It is also possible to travel by sea from Kasnäs to Hanko and continue your bike ride to Tammisaari. From Tammisaari, you can head north and return to Salo that way. The total length of the route is over 200 km. It is easy to rent a bike along the way. Additional information on bike rentals:

Salo – Halikko – Kemiönsaari – Teijo Ironworks Villages – Salo
(approx. 90 kilometres)

Have fun while biking along the maritime Little Coastal Route. The highlights of this route are the idyllic ironworks villages, beautiful views and delicious food.

Hop on a bike and get to know Salo on a route that leaves from central Salo and takes you through gorgeous seaside landscapes. Stop for a refreshing swim, feast at the local restaurants, and rest in one of the lodgings along the way.

The Korkkila ferry takes you to Kemiönsaari island where freedom and the smell of the sea are present all year round. Walk on the cliffs, smoothed down by the sea, and enjoy the fresh sea breeze before continuing to the award-winning, idyllic ironworks villages in the Teijo region.

The ironworks villages offer much to see and do throughout the year. First, you will encounter the lively Mathildedal, followed by scenic Teijo and appealing Kirjakkala. Park your bike and enjoy the warm atmosphere of the villages with some food and beverages. Kirjakkala, located between the sea and lakes, offers access to the trails, activities and nature experiences of Teijo National Park.

Ironworks Villages and Idyllic Countryside: Bicycle Trail

Explore Salo's diversity on a bike. The journey consists of archipelago views, idyllic villages, and wonderful nature, and it's best enjoyed on a leisurely bike ride.

The journey proceeds slowly, and there is no rush to get to the next destination. Stop for a refreshing break on one of Salo's best beaches at lake Lehmi-järvi, or get to know the highland cattle on Leipyöli farm amid Perniö's river views. The first one to welcome you is the cheery Mathildedal with its culinary treats and unique products. Teijo Ironworks Village offers experiences for those interested in history, culture and exercise. The last stop is the Kirjakkala Ironworks Village, where you have an opportunity to admire the wonderful nature around lake Hamarinjärvi.

Journey of Flavours in Salo: Car Tour

Take a trip for the taste buds around the delicious Salo region and fall in love with the region's cafés, restaurants, breweries and bakeries. Foodies can enjoy local foods and drinks throughout the entire route.

Grab snacks from the vast selection available at the Salo marketplace, hop in a car, and start your tour to explore the delicacies available in the Salo region. On this trip, you will enjoy slow days in idyllic cafés and unique restaurants that prepare tasty experiences from local ingredients in season. You will also get to enjoy local food purchased from farm shops, freshly brewed coffee, and locally made apple juice and cider. Beer brewed in Salo's villages and delicacies from our bakeries are excellent souvenirs.

In addition to mouth-watering food, the route contains numerous cute small shops as well as high-quality accommodation and interesting events. Get to know the award-winning villages in Salo or visit Teijo National Park to enjoy nature all year round. After this journey, you will return home with a good mood and locally produced delicacies and souvenirs.





On a hike

Hiking trail Salo – Teijo National Park

Length 21 km one way, 5–8 hours by hiking, 2–4 hours by mountain bike. Difficulty: medium. Several starting points; Salo Sports Park, Pormestarinkatu 2, Salo, WGS84: 60° 22.821', 23° 08.210') or Kirjakkala, Hamarijärventie 62, Teijo, WGS84: 60° 16.366', 22° 59.544'.

There is a connection directly from the centre of Salo, to Teijo National Park and the ironworks villages. The half-marathon hiking trail is suitable for both hiking and mountain biking. However, the trail is fairly demanding for cyclists, as the trail also includes steep hills and paths with roots.

There are forest, rock, field and lake landscapes along the hiking trail as well as small idyllic villages. The trail runs along small gravel roads, forest roads and paths. The trail follows a bicycle lane all the way to Helisnummi. Alternatively, you can start the trail from Helisnummi or Viitankruunu.

You can do the trail one-way, or divide it into shorter stages. The several starting points along the trail can be reached conveniently by Paikku. For families with children, we recommend following the trail to the Helisnummi scouts' lean-to shelter, which is easily accessed with a pram from the nearest parking area.

In addition to the lean-to shelter, you can also find the the Lehmiraanta Holiday Centre along the trail. The Holiday Centre offers accommodation and restaurant services, as well as the Lehmijärvi beach, which has a kiosk and a water point in the summer. The Kirjakkala Ironworks Village at the end of the trail offers a selection of services and activities.

In a canoe

Salo has a lot to offer for anyone who likes to paddle

Salo has peaceful rivers, narrow sea bays and interesting islands.

The Kaisaari trail (25 kilometres) is suitable for a day-long paddling trip. The trail departs from the shore of the river Salonjoki, along Satamakatu, and first goes to Kokkila along the Gulf of Halikko, where you can take your first lunch break. Continue from Kokkila to the shunt on Angelansaari Island. Under the wooden bridge you can smell genuine tar. You can make a campfire or stay the night at the Kaisaari lean-to shelter. You can choose via which side of Vartsalansaari you want to return to Salo.

Purilanjoki canoeing (14 kilometres) starts from the same place as the Kaisaari trail and runs along Rauvolanselkä nearly all the way to Vartsala. Before the village, however, you can find the River Purilanjoki on the right, which you can follow all the way to Revasvuori. Please note that it may be challenging to find the mouth of the river due to the reeds.

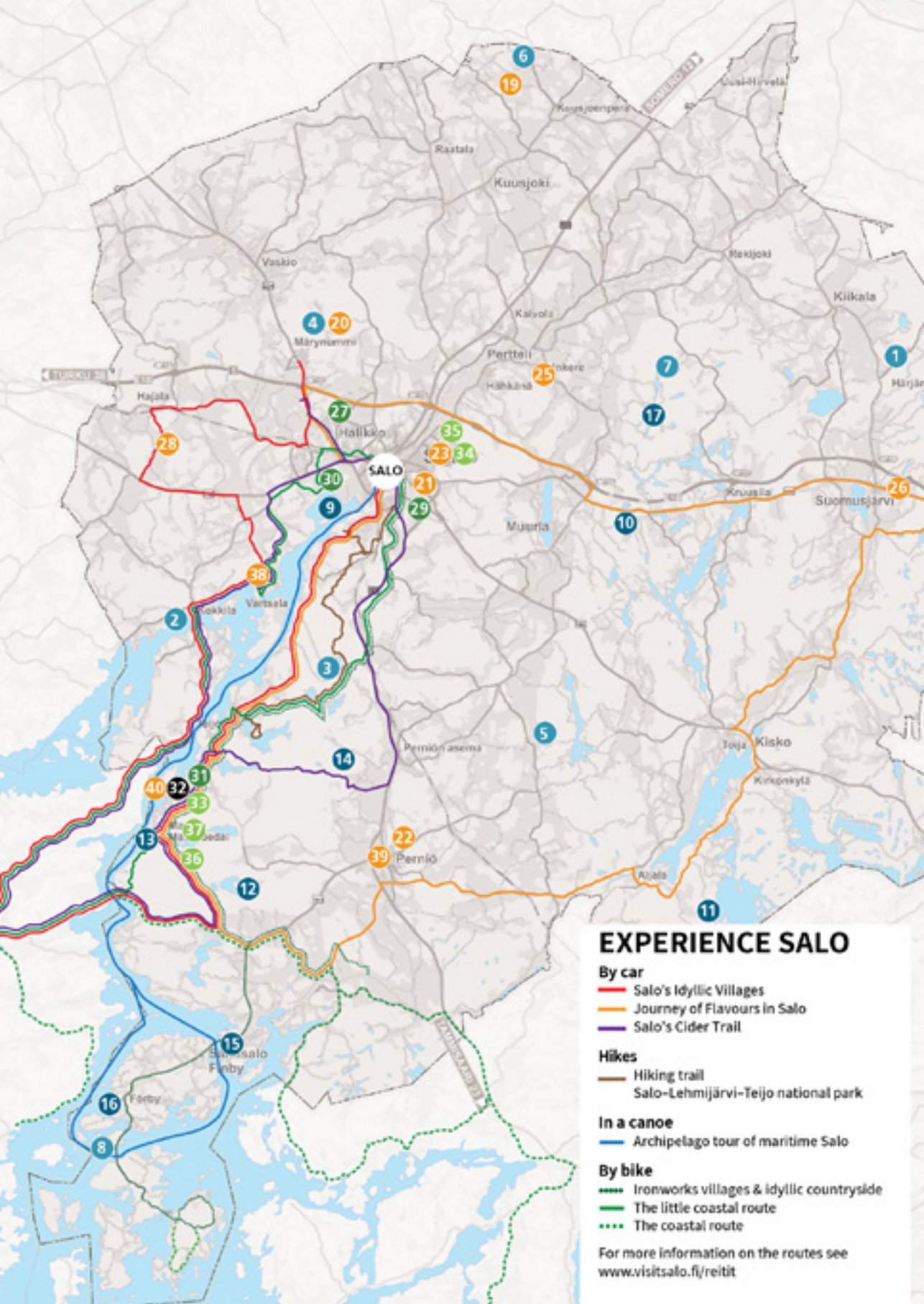
The Halikonjoki river paddling (12–16 kilometres) also begins along the river Salonjoki and passes through Wiurilanlahti to the river Halikonjoki. You can see the Joensuu manor and the Chinese bridge along the river Halikonjoki. On the way back, you can stop for a coffee and a doughnut at the Vuohensaari camping area.

The Merikotka trail (160 kilometres) starts from Vuohensaari in Salo and circles the entire Kimitoön island. Interesting villages and versatile services offered by entrepreneurs such as Matildan Marina and the Förby harbour are along the trail. In addition to paddling, this route is also perfect for boating.
