Mathildedal village is a place of authentic encounters

IN THE IDYLIC MATHILDEDAL Ironworks Village, you can find the Hotel & Café Mathildedal, a beautifully aged, small boutique-style hotel and café by the sea.

Entrepreneur **Krista Gustafsson** wanted to create a place where the authenticity of the historical milieu of the ironworks village comes together with genuine personalities.

"With us, people feel truly seen and well cared for. We look after our customers personally and we bake our goods by ourselves," she says.

Although the number of tourists in Mathildedal and its popularity have reached a new high in the 2000s, the area is still a communal and sympathetic little village.

CHARACTERISED AS AN ARTISAN VILLAGE,

Mathildedal is known for its atmosphere and history, but the surrounding nature and the many possible activities appeal to tourists. "It is quite unique that you can take a short walk of less than a kilometre from where you are staying and find yourself in a national park. In addition to hiking, there are great opportunities for mountain biking, canoeing, tennis and padel".

TEIJO NATIONAL PARK IN THE SPRING

Teijo is beautiful all year round, but early spring is my favourite time there. I love watching how nature starts to become green again.

PUMPKINS FOR THE HALLOWEEN SPIRIT

The Pumpkin Weeks in Salo bring joy during the dark autumn season. The Pumpkin Park is a great and exceptional attraction.

Welcome to the manor

WIURILA MANOR'S current owner, **Alexander Aminoff**, represents the ninth generation of manor owners after he inherited Wiurila from his mother in 2024.

As an entrepreneur, it was immediately clear to him that the idyllic environment of Wiurila should be made accessible to as many people as possible and easier to get to.

"I always emphasise that this manor is part of the living history. It is not just a prop or a museum where time has stopped around the 19th century. This is a real, live manor".

IN ADDITION TO HISTORIC BUILDINGS, Wiurila offers many things to see and experience for tourists. You can stay in the charming 4-room guesthouse and enjoy tasty local food in the Sigrid restaurant. "We also have venues for rent, an 18-hole golf course known for its beautiful landscapes, a home museum and a horse carriage museum. In the summer, Wiurila has extensive exhibitions of contemporary art.

The concept of the restaurant is deliciously simple. Gorgeous antique tableware and beautiful dishes of simple food made with local ingredients.

3x tips!

ART IN SALO ART MUSEUM

I have been strongly impressed by Salo Veturitali and its well-curated, high-quality exhibitions. I recommend it!

TRÖMPERIN KESTIKIEVARI INN

A cottage preserved mostly in its original appearance, the oldest part of which dates from the 18th century. Open in the summer, together with a café.

HALIKKO CHURCH AND MUSEUM

The beautiful medieval stone church and the nearby museum are true hidden gems. Both are also strongly connected to the history of Wiurila Manor.

Experience the beauty of the Archipelago Sea in Särkisalo

IN SALO, TRAVELLERS can get from one milieu to another in no time. If you want, you can spend time in urban surroundings or quickly retreat to a national park to enjoy the nature or the peace of the archipelago.

Särkisalo represents maritime Salo: it is a beautiful region of islands in southern Salo of approximately 700 residents. In the past centuries, people there made their living from fishing, seafaring and a limestone mining.

Ylöstalo Farm is one of the tourism companies in Särkisalo. They rent out cottages and boats and run the popular Nixor restaurant with a terrace in the summer. "People who want to experience the landscapes of the archipelago and the silence and peace of nature come here".

THE FAMOUS FISHING WATERS attract fishers and the restaurants and beautiful archipelago landscapes attract tourists. They also have venues for meetings and parties.

"Many of our customers give a special shout out to the soundscape here. For example, listening to the sounds of the sea and the birds in the early summer is always a great experience".

3x tips!

GO ON AN ADVENTURE BY BIKE

When pedalling around the small island villages, you will feel like you have entered a different country. You could cycle to islands Ulkoluoto or Pettu in Särkisalo by riding an electric bike, for example.

NIKSAARI SAUNA

The city-owned sauna has a pier that you can also use for winter swimming in the sea.

Pohjola Farm – an oasis of flavours led by three sisters

LOCATED IN THE BEAUTIFUL HERITAGE LANDSCAPE OF KISKO, Pohjola Farm is much more than a traditional farm. It's a story about roots, sisterhood and passion for clean food. The farm is run by the third-generation sisters **Minna, Nina Selin and Päivi Pohjola**, who have helped the farm that was established by Karelian resettlers after the Second World War turn into a versatile tourist destination.

"For us, it's a matter of honour to produce only the best quality. You can sell poor quality only once, whilst customers return year after year to get top quality," says the farm's business owner, Minna Pohjola.

STRAWBERRIES ARE THE HEARTBEAT OF THE FARM, but its selection has expanded into inventive delicacies. You can buy goods made from the farm's own crops in the farm shop: pear and vanilla jam, dill oil, mulled wines and the farm's new range of oats products.

Pohjola Farm changes with seasons. In the summer, the farm indulges its visitors with a summer café, second hand shop and popular afternoon tea events. In the winter season, the farm is dressed in winter decorations and the atmospheric Christmas shop opens its doors five weekends before Christmas Eve.

3x tips!

LOCAL FOOD MAP

Definitely number one! The Local food map of Salo is a great concept that lists all producers in the region.

SAUNAS AND ICE SWIMMING

There are several great places for sauna and ice swimming for both locals and tourists. For example, here in Kisko, Laineranta is like the village's shared living room.

PUMPKIN WEEKS

The event organised during the dark and rainy autumn season is an excellent way to brighten up.



Events = life

IN SALO, EVENTS are not just entertainment, but the heart of the city. **Suvi Aarnio**, cultural producer, describes Salo's event field as versatile and surprising. "We have everything from major public events to small, atmospheric village parties. For example, the nationally renowned summer evening market is a phenomenon that attracts people from even further away. It is a free event that is open to everyone, with a top artist's concert each night," Aarnio says.

SALO'S STRENGTH lies in its sense of community. Events, such as the Pumpkin Weeks that bring light to the dark autumn season, are created with local initiative and enthusiasm, and they have become the pride of the entire city.

"It's great to see people commit to the events. Here, they are a lifestyle bringing together different generations and creating a kind of team spirit".

For friends of culture and sports, Salo offers experiences all year round. Children's Saturdays, Sanojen Salo poetry festival and versatile sports events ensure that there is something for everyone.

SUVI AARNIO

praises the collective spirit of the people in Salo. Salo is a city where you will always find something to do.

EVENING MARKET

Absolutely the best thing in the summer. The atmosphere is unique and you have to experience it yourself. You rarely get to enjoy concerts of popular artists for free.

Enjoy nature easily in Salo

IF NATURE IN SALO were to be described with one word, it would be versatile.

"We have the Teijo National Park and the Hyypärä esker, which is a hilly part of the Salpausselkä ridge system. There are also different waterways and the surrounding sea," says **Aku Laaksonen**, Head of Nature Exercise at the City of Salo.

Laaksonen encourages everyone to go out and get to know nature on a low threshold. The clearly marked and various routes make it easy.

"There are nice, smaller sites close to the urban area that are easy to reach. On the other hand, there are also longer and more challenging route networks".

IN ADDITION TO HIKERS there are routes for cross-country skiers and cyclists. The popular Coastal Route takes cyclists along the coastline in the landscapes of Salo, Kimitoön, Hanko and Raseborg. "It has been described as a pleasant and relatively safe route to cycle, as the roads do not get too congested. There are also a good selection of services along the way".

3x tips!

VERSATILE TRAILS

You can find many trails of different lengths for hiking, cycling and canoeing on the websites of the City of Salo and VisitSalo.

BIRDWATCHER'S DREAM

The Salo region has some excellent bird wetlands, such as the areas near Halikonlahti Bay and Viurilanlahti Bay.

DISC GOLF COURSES

Salo has an exceptionally high number of disc golf courses that are quite close to each other, so you could visit even more than one in a day.



Events in Salo

Salo boasts a delightfully versatile range of events and culture. Salo Marketplace is the centre of the city, serving not only as a meeting and shopping place, but also as a stage for numerous events.

IN THE CENTRE OF SALO, within a short walking distance from the train station, you can find the Salo Marketplace, Salo Electronics Museum, Art Museum Veturitalli, the Plaza shopping centre and several unique brick-and-mortar shops and restaurants known for their excellent service. For those arriving by car, the city offers free parking all year round.

Explore museums and their changing art exhibitions and fascinating historical phenomena, enjoy the magic of the theatre, wonder at circus performances, fall in love with cultural films and join a sing-along. The city's successful sports teams and events hosted by local sports clubs

in the Salo Sports Park offer excitement and experiences for sports enthusiasts.

The Salo Autumn Market and the exclusive SaloJazz Festival are the perfect combination of a market atmosphere and thrilling music at the turn of September and October. The Pumpkin Weeks in October, on the other hand, are a feel-good event for people of all ages.

As we turn to winter, the festive Christmas markets and events are an irreplaceable Christmas tradition for many visitors. For the coolest visitors, we strongly recommend the Ice Swimming Rush Experience, which invites you to try winter swimming around Salo.

The immediate proximity of the sea, the 18th century manor milieu, the rolling, forested landscape of Teijo National Park with its rocks, lakes and rapids all come together to make Teijo a unique destination.

IN 1686, one of Finland's most significant ironworks rose on the eastern shore of Bay Halikonlahti, the grounds of old Teijo Manor. At that time, the provincial governor of Turku and Pori received permission from the king to build a blast furnace in the delta of River Teijonjoki.

Today, the idyllic Teijo Ironworks Village brilliantly combines diverse natural beauty with cultural heritage and a vibrant village community. The village offers versatile services as well as cultural activities and events.

Culturally and historically, the most significant regional sights are found right in the middle of the village: Teijo stone church, the old blast furnace of the ironworks and the rococo-style Teijo Manor, which is considered the most beautiful building of this architectural style in Finland. Just a short distance away lies the Lake Sahajärvi Nature Reserve that consists of the former parks and forests of the manor and is known as the pearl of the national park.

Teijo Ironworks Village offers much to see and experience for the entire family, all year round. Visit the art exhibitions of Teijon Masuuni, the handicrafts and Christmas markets, Teijo Midsummer festival or the Wanhajan Markkinat – Old-timey Market.

Kirjakkala ironworks village

The history of Kirjakkala begins in 1686 when Finland's 11th ironworks was established in the village. The peaceful Kirjakkala is located by the trail networks of Teijo National Park, and by two lakes and the sea.

The old log buildings in **KIRJAKKALA IRONWORKS VILLAGE** are from the late 19th century and they have been restored to their original appearance. They are located in the middle of a stunning grove. The old, tall oak and linden trees provide shade on hot summer days, and the river flowing through the yard area creates a peaceful atmosphere. While strolling in the ironworks manor's hazel garden, you can almost smell the old ironmaster's cigar.

The ironworks is located right on the shore of Lake Hamarijärvi. You can admire the beautiful lake landscape sitting on a dam that is over 300 years old.

In Teijo National Park, beautiful trails, beaches and campfire sites await hikers, as well as forests full of mushrooms and berries in the autumn. Waterways, small bays and campfire sites provide an excellent environment for paddling and rowing – you can rent boats and kayaks in the summer.

The accommodation, party and conference venues are located in the old log houses in the same yard.

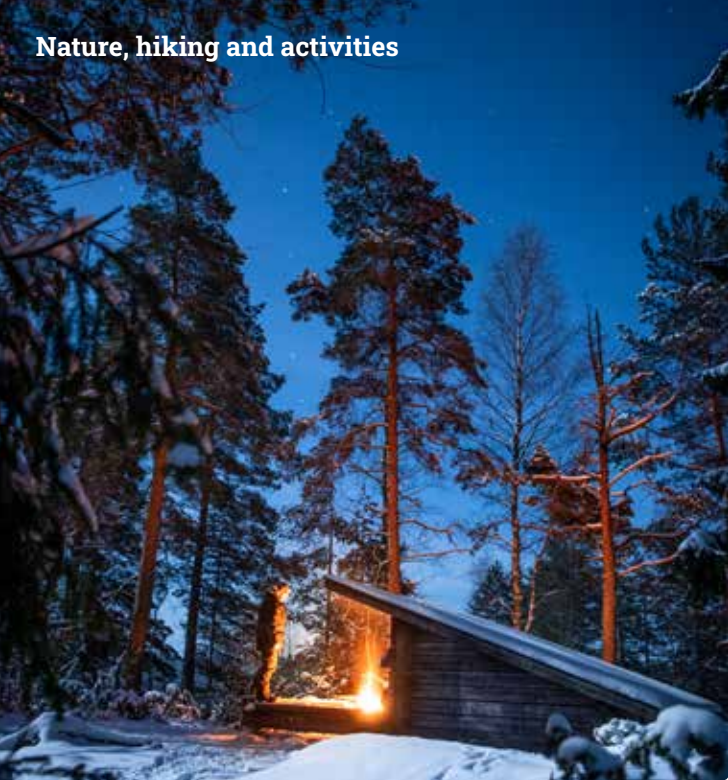
Onnelannummi trail 4 kilometres (1.5–2.5 hours)

The trail starts near Kirjakkala village. After walking for less than one kilometre, you will reach the Onnelannummi pine heath with its reservable camping area available for groups.

Signs then lead you on from Onnelannummi to the Hamarijärvi campfire site, which is a perfect place to take a break and admire the peace and quiet of Lake Hamarijärvi.

The beautiful trail goes close to the water, but the most spectacular scenery opens up from the viewpoint of Nikkakallio rock.

Nature, hiking and activities

Salo is known for the gorgeous Teijo National Park, and the region has many excellent hiking destinations where you can explore our cultural history and diverse nature. The hiking paths and nature surroundings are constantly developed, and accessibility has also been improved.

NATURE LOVERS SHOULD definitely visit the Teijo National Park. The area has a total of 50 kilometres of marked trails – even on a short trek, you can see stark rocks, lake scenery, peat and forest. The area also has campfire sites, lean-tos and fishing spots. At Teijo, you can be charmed by the natural peace and go hiking, paddling and swimming.

The ancient and cultural paths around Salo tell you about the diverse history of our region, highlighting the stories of the early settlers. Explore the life of birds and plants and the landscape, formed by the Ice Age, on our nature paths and around rapids.

Salo is an oasis for active people – for example, there are three golfing courses that meet international standards and have the longest golf seasons in Finland. Maritime Särkisalo is known for its good fishing waters, and Salo Sports Park is an oasis at the heart of the city. Our successful local sports teams and various events organised by active sports clubs in high-quality settings offer sport-related excitement and experiences in every season.

Here, you can enjoy sports and nature year-round on a bike, hike, skis, in a canoe, by swimming, riding horses or downhill driving with a mountain cross cart.



Teijo National Park

Located right next to the Teijo Ironworks Villages, Teijo National Park provides an opportunity to experience the diverse Finnish nature. The landscapes range from peaty forests to mires, groves and cliffs. The mosaic of lakes and proximity to the sea are also part of Teijo’s atmosphere.

Teijo offers up to 50 kilometres of well-marked hiking trails. Some of the trails have been built to be accessible for wheelchair users and pedestrians with prams. The most popular trail in the national park runs **around Lake Matildanjärvi** (5.5 km). The specialties of the **Lake Sahajärvi trail** (8.8 kilometres) are its two manually pulled ferries. **Totti nature trail** (1.3 km) and **Muurahaispolku trail** (1.3 km) are well-suited, comfortable nature trails for families with children.

We recommend starting the excursion from the Teijo Visitor Centre south of Lake Matildanjärvi. At the Visitor Centre, you can get tips and maps for your trip. The entrepreneur-led Visitor Centre also has a café and an equipment rental company. Matildanjärvi lake is a recreational and fishing destination. Rent a canoe, kayak, rowing boat or SUP board. The area also has trails for mountain bikers.

Hiking Trail Salo–Lehmijärvi–Teijo National Park

Length 21 km one way, 5–8 hours by hiking, 2–4 hours by mountain bike. Difficulty: medium. Several starting points; Salo Sports Park, Pormestarinkatu 2, Salo, WGS84: 60° 22.821', 23° 08.210') or Kirjakkala, Hamarijärventie 62, Teijo, WGS84: 60° 16.366', 22° 59.544'

There is a connection directly from the centre of Salo, to Teijo National Park and the ironworks villages. The half-marathon hiking trail is suitable for both hiking and mountain biking. However, the trail is fairly demanding for cyclists, as the trail also includes steep hills and paths with roots.

You can do the trail one-way, or divide it into shorter stages. For families with children, we recommend following the trail to the Helisnummi scouts’ lean-to shelter, which is easily accessed with a pram from the nearest parking area.



Halikonlahti Bay

Bird trail, length: 3.1 km, Duration: one hour. Difficulty: easy. Place of departure: Satamakatu 69, Salo, WGS84: 60° 22.033', 23° 04.975'

In Bay Halikonlahti, you can find a birdwatching tower, an accessible birdwatching platform and hidden huts. There are two routes in the area: an accessible trail and a bird trail. The accessible trail is suitable for use with wheelchairs or prams.

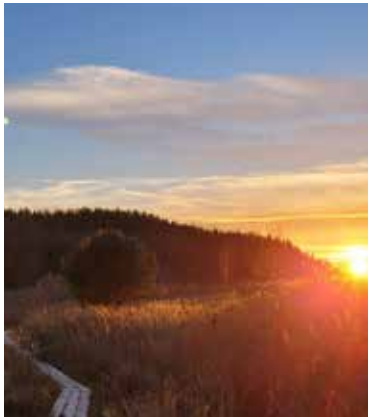

Vuohensaari
Length: 0.6–2 km, **duration:** 0.5–1 hours. **Difficulty:** medium.
Place of departure: Satamakatu 100, Salo, WGS84: 60° 21.816', 23° 03.937'
Four kilometres from the centre of Salo is the rugged Vuohensaari Island, which is populated by primeval forests. Vuohensaari nature trails lead hikers to primeval forests, groves, coastal cliffs and historical sites. The nature trail consists of the Kreivi trail (0.9 kilometres) and the related Kippari trail and Torppari trail, the latter of which is suitable for prams.

The island's services also include a camping area, café, summer theatre, swimming place, mini golf course and playground.



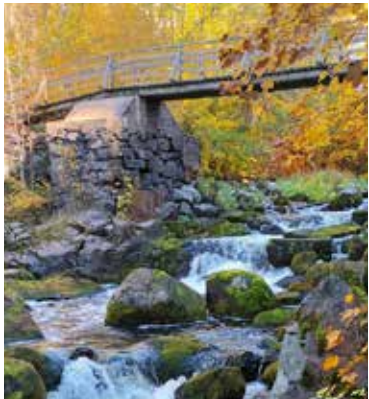
Viitankruunu
Length: 3.5 km, **duration:** one hour. **Difficulty:** medium.
Place of departure: Merikulmantie 259, Salo, WGS84: 60° 21.557', 23° 05.384'
The main attraction of the trail is the three impressive, bronze-age burial stones of Viitankruunu. For birdwatchers, there is a birdwatching platform on the shore, with a good view of the significant bird bay of Bay Halikonlahti. The lean-to shelter in the area offers a magnificent view of the bay. Please note that if you want to make a fire, you should always check the warnings and bring your own firewood with you.

The Omenalaakso trail (1.6 kilometres) marked in blue tours the easy terrain of the local nature and cycling roads. The Viitanpolku trail section (0.7 kilometres) along the shore of Viitankruunu is also suitable for prams.



Hyyppä
Length: 1.8–2.3 km, **duration:** one hour. **Difficulty:** medium–demanding.
Place of departure: Oinasjärventie 366, Kiikala, WGS84: 60° 27.216', 23° 38.016'
The traces of the Ice Age are strongly visible in Hyyppä. Hyyppäharju, part of Salpausselkä, offers hikers plenty to see, as well as plenty of height differences. The enormous kettle holes and the mysterious Kultalähde spring fascinate hikers.

Kultalähde spring, found along the trails, is one of the most important springs in southern Finland. The spring, surrounded by endangered plants, must not be circled and fishing is prohibited there.



Latokartanonkoski Rapids
Length: 2.2 km, **duration:** 0.5–1 hours. **Difficulty:** medium.
Place of departure: Hästöntie 140, Perniö, WGS84: 60° 07.816', 23° 09.357'
Surging rapids, lush shore groves and interesting history. Latokartanonkoski is an excellent hiking destination for the whole family. The history of the Latokartano mill extends to the Middle Ages, and is part of a significant built cultural environment. The current mill ceased its operations in the 1960s.
The nature trail consists of the basic trail marked in yellow, and green dead ends. Although the nature trail is demanding in places and contains stairs, the trail is also suitable for walking with a pram up to the ruins of the mill.



Sauli Niinistö Sports Park is an oasis at the heart of the city

Sauli Niinistö Sports Park is located approximately one kilometre from the city centre. There's plenty of room to move in the park on its nearly 100 hectares. The Sports Park, which is located right off the city centre, offers a wide range of areas for dozens of different sports and fitness activities, both indoor and outdoor.

In the Sports Park, you can skateboard, swim, ride horses, take up athletics, ice skate in the ice hall, golf, bowl, play tennis, padel, basketball or football, do a stair workout and ski (in the winter). On the other hand, spectators can enjoy league-level matches of futsal, basketball and volleyball. There are also outdoor fitness equipment and a family park in the area. The Pahkavuori disc golf course is within walking distance of the Sports Park.

There is a versatile swimming hall at the centre of the Sports Park. In addition to swimming pools, it has a 30-metre water slide, a cold pool and a diving platform. In front of the building, you can admire Pekka Jylhä's artwork, Joy, which is a gigantic and colourful beach ball.

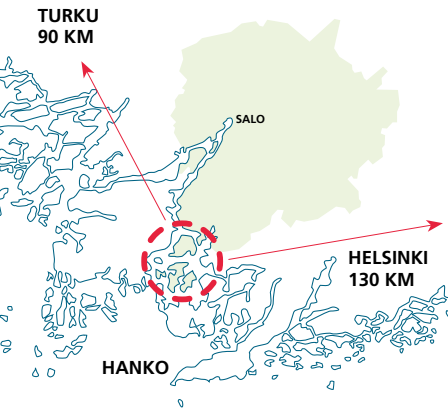


Maritime Särkisalo

THE SOUTHERNMOST POINT OF SALO, Särkisalo, is a popular place to be in the summer. The number of inhabitants increases fourfold during the summer, as those with summer cottages arrive and the harbours are filled with boats. Visitors can enjoy local delicacies on the terraces of summer cafés and restaurants in a beautiful nature scenery. Särkisalo is surrounded by the sea and the area has diverse tree species. Buildings painted with red ochre peeking out here and there are sure to catch your eye.

Särkisalo consists of a small strip of land and numerous islands – there are places worth visiting on all the bigger islands. Go on a day trip by car, boat, kayak or bicycle. You can also explore Särkisalo by foot. If you need a break, you can find Liars’ Benches (Valehtelijan taukopenkit) built by the locals along nature trails in Särkisalo.

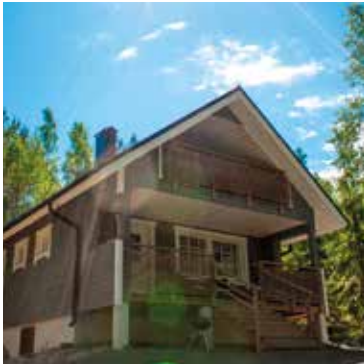

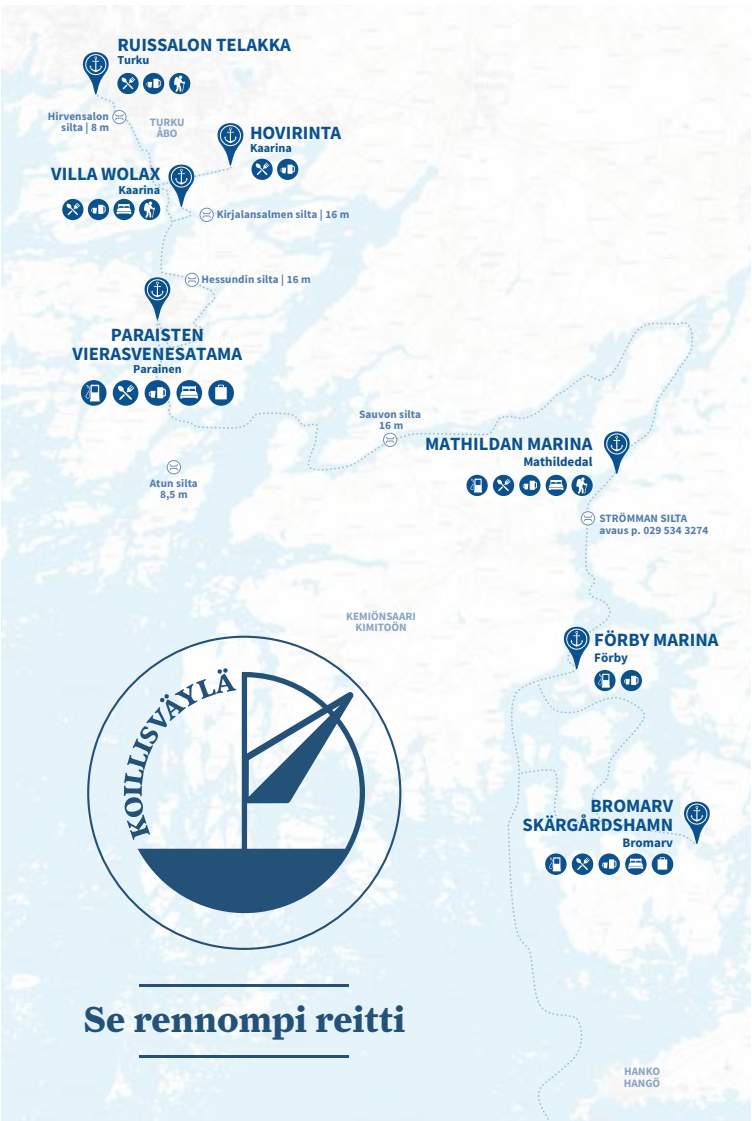

Delicacies for every taste

The countryside of Salo offers holidaymakers diverse, genuine experiences and delicious local foods. Food tourists should head to farms that sell locally produced food, where they can also experience a piece of the farm's everyday life in the quaint countryside. You can also enjoy tasty local food in the many cafés and restaurants that use high-quality local ingredients.

SALO IS THE TREASURE TROVE OF LOCAL FOOD and one of the largest agricultural cities in Finland. A significant proportion of Finnish bread grain is grown in large fields in the area. Pumpkins, berries and, of course, outdoor cucumbers are grown on outdoor garden farms, and their domestic production is concentrated in the Salo region. Farmers in Salo also grow special plants such as broad beans, sugar beet, spelt and caraway.

Together with Somero, Salo is Finland's largest producer of mutton, sheep's wool and sheepskins. You can buy a variety of responsibly produced meat from animal farms. Fruit and berries are also grown in Salo: local apple groves produce jams, juices and especially cider. The Finnish genuine cider is made of unpasteurised 100% juice with natural fermentation methods, avoiding additives. Four out

of the fourteen Finnish farms producing genuine cider are located in Salo.

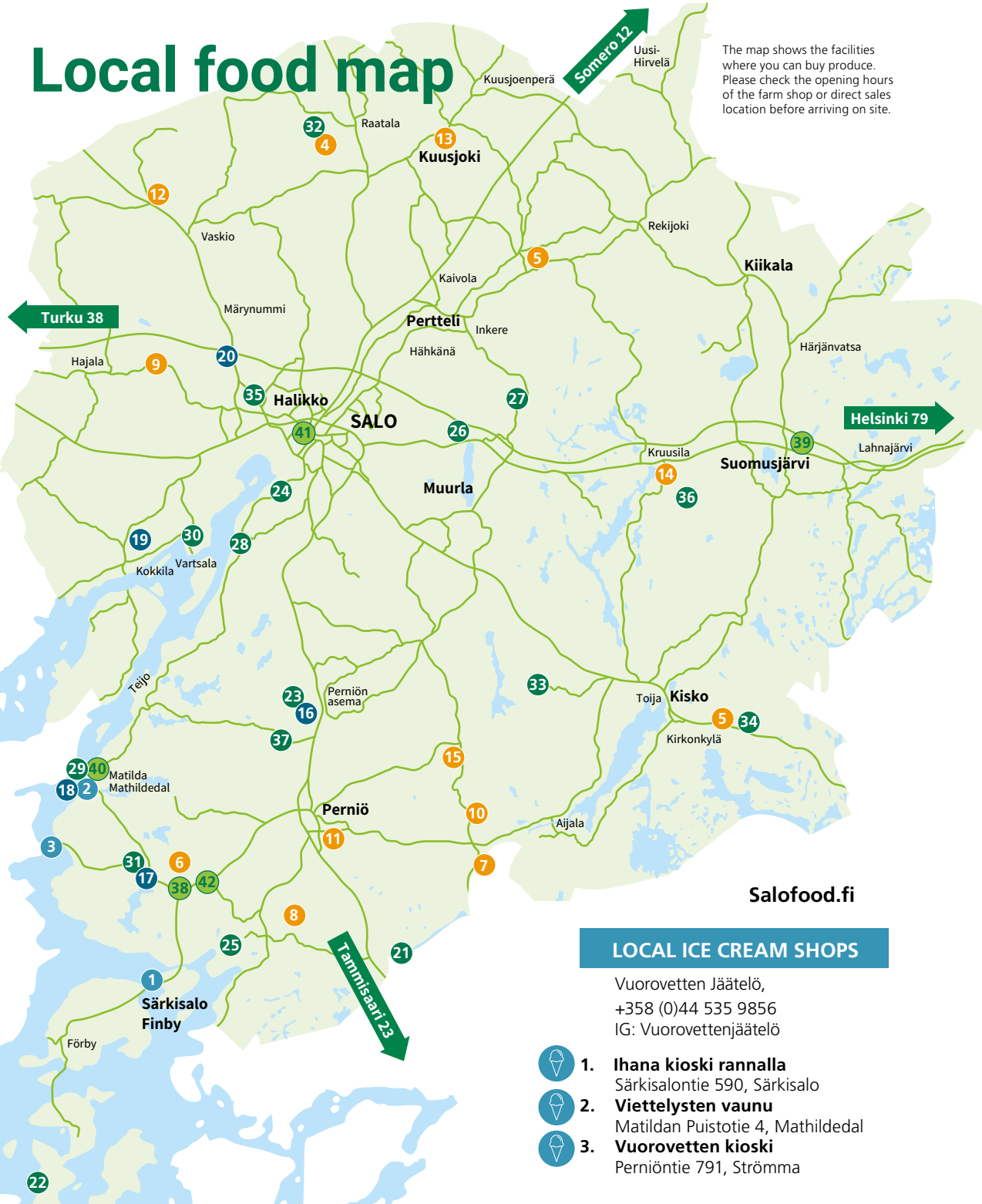

Established in 1982, Varikattilanmäki Nature Reserve offers plenty to see: the rocky nature of Southwest Finland, its views and the historical “Russki Oven”. The Ice Age has left its marks on the landscape, such as shingle ridges and erratic boulders.

The trail leading to Varikattilanmäki (3.2 km) is medium-level. In addition to cliffs, the diverse nature also includes peaty forests and mire woodlands. The Eero Trail (2.6 km) is a much easier outdoor trail than Varikattilankierros. Both routes depart from Lehmiranta.

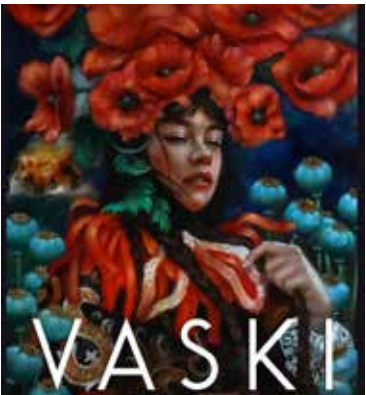

Vaisakko Nature Trail

Length: 4.5 km, duration: 1–2 hours. Difficulty: easy–medium
Place of departure: Palttatie 24, Halikko, WGS84: 60° 21.828', 23° 01.839'

The Vaisakko grove, one of the most impressive groves in Finland, is an excellent day trip destination for all friends of nature. The nature reserve is at its most beautiful during the spring when the anemones bloom. In the summer, the dense foliage of the trees creates a rainforest-like atmosphere. The colourful autumn foliage of the grove is truly impressive.

Vaisakko’s history of crofts is still visible in the heart of the grove. There have been crofting settlements in Vaisakko since the 18th century until 1959.

The Vaisakko Nature Trail consists of an easily accessible gravelled trail, which is also suitable for prams. There is also a spring along this section. The nature reserve starts with narrow narrow duckboards. The grove has a trail that is about 1.5 kilometres long, and which includes stairs and height differences. The Vaisakko cliffs with its impressive seascape offer a perfect place for a picnic.



Rikalanmäki ancient trails

Length: 2.5 km, duration: one hour. Difficulty: mostly easy.
Place of departure: Rikalantie 77, Halikko, WGS84: 60° 23.468', 23° 03.644'

Rikalanmäki’s ancient trails offer interesting history and diverse plant species. The history of Rikalanmäki extends up to 4,000 years ago, when the current hill was an island in the sea.

Rikalanmäki was an important hub of trade. The Iron Age finds, as well as the finds that indicate the locations of ancient burial grounds and cremation cemeteries, tell of a long history of habitation in the area. Linnamäki, on the other hand, housed an ancient castle that provided a good defensive position in the late Iron Age.

Rikalanmäki’s ancient trails consist of the ancient trails of Rikalanmäki and Linnamäki, and a connecting route between them. The trail is easy, with the exception of the steep trail leading to the top of Linnamäki. Rikala Krouvi offers restaurant and catering services in the area. Rikalanmäki also has the Theatre Provinssi summer theatre.

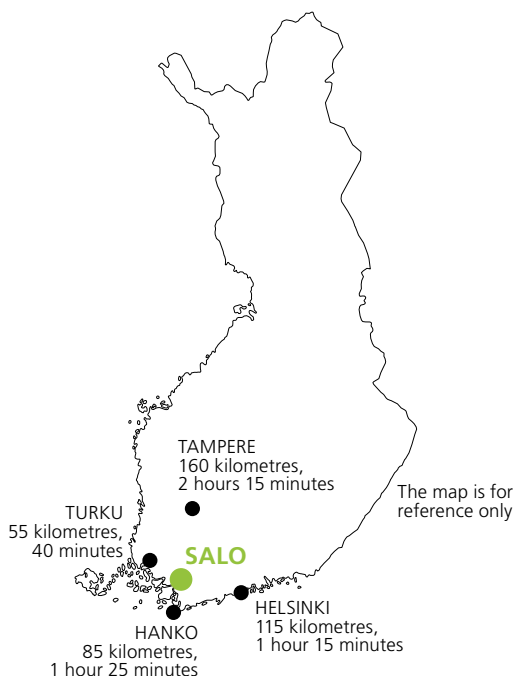
